Former State Legislator, Reilly, Dies

Robert C. Reilly, former Democratic state representative and senator from Dubuque County, died Saturday at Mercy Medical Center. He was 64.

Reilly, who lived at 1566 Parkway, was employed as a field representative for the State Department of Revenue. He served

six terms in the House of Representatives and five terms in the Senate in the 1940's and 50's.

He was the first legislator to introduce a bill that would provide bus service for all school children.

He also worked as a representative for Family Benefit of Waterloo.

Mr. Reilly was a member of the Holy Name Society of St. Joseph's Parish; the Dubuque Business and Traveling Men's Assn., and the Pioneer Law Makers. He graduated from Loras Academy and Marquette University in Milwaukee.

Services will be at 9 a.m. Tuesday at St. Joseph's Church with burial in Mount Olivet Cemetery. The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Michael J. Martin, pastor, will officiate at the Requiem Mass. Friends may call after 2 p.m. Monday at the Hoffmann Mortuary.

Mr. Reilly was born in Dubuque, son of the late Thomas and Margaret Mahoney Reilly, and lived here all his life.

He was married to Regina (Jean) Moes at St. Columbkille's Church.

Surviving are his widow; a son, Roger J., at home; and a brother, Cletus R., Wauwatosa, Wis.

He was preceded in death by his parents, six brothers and a sister.

REDSTONE. House, named for the color of the building stone, constructed by A.A. COOPER for his daughter. Built in 1888 by architect Thomas T. Carkeek, the home was designed as a duplex. The building was later converted into apartments and in the early 1970s a popular nightspot. Threatened with demolition in the early 1980s, the Redstone was saved by the Dubuque Historic Improvement Company which invested in renovation projects allowing the building to be opened to the public as a fashionable bed-and-breakfast in ceremonies held on April 9, 1985.

REGALS. Independent basketball team of the early 1920s. Operating without a manager or a coach, the Regals managed to win many victories. One year they reached the state tournament, but were beaten by a team from Council Bluffs which was made up of pros. The Regals, who also played in the Y League, included Gerald (Red) MCALEECE, Casey Erie, John Palmer, Peter McInerney, Joseph Schwendinger, and Clyde Washburn.

REIFF FUNERAL HOMES. Business. The predecessor of the Reiff Funeral Homes was established in 1928 by Leo Sanner. Embalming was done in the home of the deceased, and Sanner leased a hearse from Al WIDESCH of DUBUQUE until he could purchase his own. In 1937, the Sanner Funeral Home was opened at 303 1st Avenue N.W. in FARLEY. Sanner owned and operated this business for twenty-nine years during which time he was assisted, beginning in the late 1950s, by Robert REIFF. In 1959, the business was purchased by Reiff and operated as the Reiff Sanner Funeral Home. By this time, a hearse had been obtained, and all embalmings were done in the funeral home's facilities. Rooms were added to the Home for the display of caskets, a viewing room, and to provide an office. Following the death of Robert Reiff in 1988, his son Joseph took over the business which expanded in DUBUQUE COUNTY.

REIFF, Robert W. (DYERSVILLE, IA, May 28, 1924—DUBUQUE, IA, Nov. 27, 1988). Funeral director. Reiff, a graduate of the College of Mortuary Science in St. Louis in 1947, owned and operated the REIFF FUNERAL HOMES in CASCADE, Dyersville, EPWORTH, and FARLEY. He was a member of the Farley Commercial Club and a retired member of the Farley Fire Department.

REILLY, C. Michael. (DUBUQUE, IA, Mar. 22, 1942—). Athlete. In addition to being a member of the Mississippi Valley Conference First Team (1958, 1959), *Des Moines Register* All State Team (1959), All Big Ten Team and *Look* magazine All American Team (1963), Reilly was named to the University of Iowa all-time football team in 1970 and 1989. He played

professional football for the Chicago Bears (1964 to 1969) and the Minnesota Vikings for one year. Reilly chaired the Recreation and Playground Commission in 1978 and provided color commentary for RADIO broadcasts of University of Iowa football games for many years. Reilly joined FIRST NATIONAL BANK as a marketing and business development officer and rose to the position of vice-president of marketing. He later worked for Frank Hardie Advertising.

REILLY, Robert C. (DUBUQUE, IA, Aug. 5, 1904—Dubuque, IA, Nov. 2, 1968). State representative. Reilly, the son of a former chief of police in Dubuque, represented DUBUQUE COUNTY in the Iowa House of Representatives serving in the 48th and 49th general assemblies from 1939 to 1941. He then served in the Iowa Senate from 1943 to 1949. Reilly was president of the Second District Democratic Club of Iowa in 1940.

REILLY, William J. (Eden, WI, July 4, 1924—Iowa City, IA, June 15, 1994). Real estate developer. The owner of Reilly Realty for twenty-three years, Reilly was the co-developer of Plaza 20 and a former president of the Dubuque Board of Realty.

REISBERG, Roger. (DYERSVILLE, IA—). RADIO station manager. In 1996, Reisberg became the station manager of KDST in Dyersville. A member since 1972 of the Dyersville Business Council, a group instrumental in organizing the DYERSVILLE AREA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, Reisberg was on the retail committee of the Chamber in 1997.

REITER, Walter P. (CASCADE, IA, Oct. 23, 1926—Cascade, IA, Aug. 29, 1991). Township trustee. A farmer in the rural Cascade area all his life, Reiter was a charter member of the Iowa Cattlemen's Association and a member of the Farm Bureau Association. He served as a township trustee for WHITEWATER TOWNSHIP for five years.

RENIER, James J. (DUBUQUE, IA, Apr. 16, 1920—Dubuque, IA, Apr. 10, 1994). President, Renier's TV Stereo & Video. Renier, a graduate of LORAS COLLEGE, served on many boards and commissions and directed the business which had been family-owned for ninety-five years. He was one of the first to recognize the sales potential of such products as the video cassette recorder and served as the president of the National Association of Retail Dealers of America.

RESURRECTION CHURCH. Officially dedicated as a Catholic church in DUBUQUE on May 17, 1986, in a Mass conducted by Archbishop Daniel KUCERA. Resurrection dates from St. Philomena's Church, the

Chester Scheerer was born at Ottawa, Illinois, on August 29, 1899, moved to Fort Dodge, Iowa, in 1901. He attended Webster County public schools and business college and Iowa State College.

He married Mary Weaver in 1920 and they had four daughters. They moved to Boone County in 1931.

He was farming in Boone County when elected to the Fifty-fifth and Fifty-sixth General Assemblies. He was named Master Corn Producer in 1941; Master Swine Producer in 1951. Helped organize Boone-Greene County R.E.A. Served on board of directors for twelve years as president or vice president. Organization director of Boone County Farm Bureau eight years; also secretary, vice president and president. President, Boone County Fair, three years. Served on county draft board; War Mobilization Board; Ration Board. He was an active member of the Methodist Church, Masonic Lodge, Chamber of Commerce and Rotary Club.

Mr. Scheerer, a Republican, served in the Fifty-fifth and Fifty-sixth General Assemblies.

Mr. Scheerer died March 11, 1968, of injuries suffered March 4 in an auto accident. Surviving are four daughters, Mrs. Max Kraeger of Newton, Mrs. L. J. Magnall of Tripoli, Mrs. J. C. Doran of Beaver and Mrs. L. J. Caffrey, Jr., of Boone; a brother; five sisters; fourteen grandchildren and a great-grandson.
