The statistics for the year 1924 show that the Butler County jail housed only 30 inmates compared to 54 so far in 1974. Henry Burma Rites Held Wednesday

Death came to Allison's most prominent resident Sunday evening when veteran Iowa public official Henry W. Burma passed away after a long illness. He was 80 years of age.



Burma was Butler County Sheriff from 1923 to 1926 and served four terms in the Iowa legislature as a representative from Butler County. In his final term he was elected and served as Speaker of the House. Later he was an unsuccessful candidate for Governor of Iowa in 1944.

Long interested in penology and law enforcement, he closed out his career in public service by serving as a Juvenile Probation Officer from 1954 until 1967 at which time he retired.

For 10 years from 1944 to 1954 he was a member of the all-important Iowa Board of Control which directed affairs at all Iowa institutions. He was appointed to this post by Governor William Beardesley.

Deceased was born in Butler County Nov. 7, 1895 and attended country school before completing his education at the high school in Allison. During the first years that followed he engaged in farming, real estate and various other business enterprises. He was always very active in Allison community affairs.

He was a World War I veteran and first got into Republican

Party politics several years after his return home when he was elected County Sheriff.

Throughout his life he was a faithful member of the United Church of Christ in Allison. He was very active in the Eastern Star and in the Masonic Lodge and the El Kahir Shrine of Cedar Rapids. He was also a member of the American Legion and of the Butler County Historical Society.

Henry Burma was married to Katherine McGinn on June 30, 1924. His wife preceded him in death as did his parents and also his one son Charles and one daughter, Marjorie (Mrs. David Barber). His son-in-law, David Barber of Rockford, Ill., survives, along with his daughter-in-law, Mrs. Shirley Burma of (Continued on page 6)


