

## Rites Held For Curtis Gregory

Funeral services were held Monday, December 21, for Curtis W. Gregory, a widely known Adel attorney. Mr. Gregory, 73, suffered a fatal heart attack while on his way to work after dinner Friday, Dec. 18. Services were held at the Adel Christian Church at 2 p.m. with Rev. Claude Wood officiating.

He was born in Winterset in 1897. He lived in Des Moines before moving to Adel. An accomplished musician, Mr. Gregory led the Adel band for many years. He served two terms in the Iowa Legislature and was House Republican leader in 1941. He was appointed assistant attorney general in 1942 and served in the office for three years. He was a graduate of Drake University Law School and a member of the American Bar Association, the Iowa Bar Association and the Dallas County Bar Association. He was a charter member of the Adel Lions Club, the Masonic Lodge, Za-Ga-Zig Shrine, the Adel Christian Church and served the Boy Scout organization for many years.

Casket bearers at the services Monday were Donald Forsman, Russell Glenn, Cedric Glenn, Russell Oneal, Murray Luther and Robert Webster. Honorary bearers were W. E. Bridges, George Sackett, Robert E. Frush, John T. Beeston, James Van Werden, Gordon Russell and Lloyd Godfrey. Mrs. Harold Hunter was soloist, accompanied by Mrs. Robert Smith. Burial was at Oakdale Cemetery, in Adel.

Mr. Gregory is survived by his wife, Ethel; a stepson, Millard Bell, of West Des Moines and two step grandchildren.
