Prominent Keokuk resident, Stanley L. Hart, dies Tuesday

One of Keokuk's most widely-known and popular citizens, Stanley L. Hart, 77, died at 10:20 p. m., Tuesday, November 20, in Graham hospital where he had been a patient for one day.

Lovingly called "Senator" by his friends and associates, Mr. Hart served in the Iowa State Senate from 1937 until 1955. He served three terms as President Pro Tem of the senate. Widely known and highly regarded throughout the state of Iowa, Hart was urged by his party to run for governor, but declined the offer. He was a member of the Pioneer Lawmakers.

Hart was Kraft Foods distributor in Keokuk for many years. He was also owner and operator of the Keokuk Barrel Company. He served for many years on the board of directors of the Keokuk Savings Bank and Trust. He was serving on the board of directors of the Security State Bank at the time of his death. He was a long time member of both the Salvation Army Advisory Board and the Keokuk Rotary club. He served the Salvation Army for over 15 years and had been a member of Rotary since the 1930's. He had served as an inheritance tax appraiser for 20 years.

Extremely active in the work of his church, Mr. Hart had served at St. John's Episcopal church as a vestryman, junior and senior warden, and delegate or alternate delegate to the Diocesan Convention for 25 years. He also served one term as vice president of the Diocesan Convention, two times as member of the council, member of the Executive Council of Province Six of the Northwest District, delegate to the General Convention in Miami in 1968, and trustee of Seabury Western Seminary at Evanston, Ill. He was presently an honorary trustee of Seabury.

A World War I veteran, he was a member of the American Legion, the 40-8 club, and the VFW.

The son of Stark L. and Anna Johnson Hart, Stanley L. Hart was born in Woodstock, Ill., March 21, 1896. He married Kathryn Pyle, June 12, 1929, in Los Angeles, Calif. She survives.

He is also survived by one daughter, Marilyn Hart Galanoy, Newport Beach, Calif.; one son, Stanley L. Hart, Jr.,

Hamilton, Ill.; one brother, E. G. Hart, Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.; and five grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by two brothers, Klare and Mel; and two sisters, Alice and Sylvia.

Funeral service has been tentatively set for 2 p. m., Friday, November 23, at St. John's Episcopal church with the Rev. Donald E. Baustian officiating. The family has requested memorials be given to St. John's church.

Has owned and operated his own drug store in Missouri Valley for 42 years. President of Druggists' Mutual Insurance Company, past president Iowa Pharmaceutical Association, member of the Masonic Lodge, Kiwanis Club and trustee of First Presbyterian church. Married Vera Foss of Missouri Valley in 1907 and has one son. Serving second session in the state senate.



HATTERY, John R., Nevada *Republican*
31st Senatorial District—Boone and Story Counties

Born June 27, 1897, on a farm near Collins in Story county, Iowa; graduated from Collins high school. Rural mail carrier before serving in army as machine gun officer during World War. Farmer for a time after the war before he was named sheriff of Story county. June 1, 1935, he was appointed chief of first highway patrol established in Iowa. Studied law during these years and passed the Iowa bar in 1937 to begin practice of law in Nevada two years later upon leaving the patrol. President of State Bank and Trust Co., of Story County Loan and Abstract Co., and of Iowa safety council. Married Gladys Hansen of Nevada, June 24, 1940. Serving first term in Senate.



HENNINGSEN, O. H., Clinton *Republican*
22nd Senatorial District—Clinton County

Born at Clinton, Iowa, Sept. 15, 1883. Attended public schools and business college of Clinton. Member city council for four years; board of education three years; president of board one year. Secretary and treasurer of Clinton real estate board 15 years. Secretary and General Manager Clinton Plate Glass Association for 17 years; also is engaged in insurance and real estate business. Appointed Clinton postmaster by President Hoover in 1932. Member of all Masonic bodies and O. E. S. Past Exalted Ruler B. P. O. E.; Past Noble Grand I. O. O. F.; member of Clinton Chamber of Commerce, Rotary Club, F. O. E., L. O. O. M. Married Jan. 20, 1909, to Ethel May Bohart of Clinton; father of one son, Dr. A. B. Henningsen. Elected to senate in 1938.



THOMAS J. FREY

MR. PRESIDENT: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable Thomas J. Frey, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Thomas J. Frey was born February 5, 1901 at Aplington, Iowa, the son of Mr. and Mrs. John Frey. He attended school in Aplington and was graduated from the Waterloo Business College in 1919, the Schmeby School of Advertising in 1922 and the School of Journalism, University of Iowa Extension Department in 1943.

In 1941, Mr. Frey was married to Helen Clure of Greenfield. They have three sons, Tom, Robert and William, and one daughter, Patricia.

A World War II veteran, he was in the Navy from 1942 to 1945 and served overseas for nineteen months. He was past president of the Neola Swimming Pool Association; President of the Neola Civic Association; Commander of the Neola American Legion Post; Pottawattamie County Legion Commander and Seventh District Vice Commander. He was a member of the State Board of the American Cancer Society for ten years and an active member of the Iowa Newspaper Publishers Association. He was publisher of three newspapers, the Neola Gazette-Reporter, the Minden-Shelby News and the Earling Echo.

Tom Frey was elected to the Iowa House of Representatives from Pottawattamie County in 1950 and served during the Fifty-fourth, Fifty-fifth, Fifty-sixth and Fifty-seventh General Assemblies. He was then elected to the Senate in 1966 and served during the Sixty-second and Sixty-third General Assemblies.

Mr. Frey passed away on July 12, 1973 at the age of 72. He is survived by his wife, Helen, and the three sons and one daughter; another daughter, Janice, by a previous marriage; two sisters and one brother; his stepmother; two stepbrothers; two stepsisters; and two grandchildren.

STANLEY L. HART

MR. PRESIDENT: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the Honorable Stanley L. Hart, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Stanley Lawrence Hart was born in Woodstock, Illinois, March 21, 1896, son of Stark L. and Anna Johnson Hart. He attended public schools in Woodstock and the School of Commerce in Chicago. A veteran of World War I, he served with the American Expeditionary Forces in France and Germany and was a member of the American Legion, the Forty and Eight Club and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

On June 12, 1929, Mr. Hart was married to Kathryn Pyle in Los Angeles, California. They had one daughter and one son.

Mr. Hart was in business in Des Moines, Iowa until 1923 and in Los Angeles, California until 1932. He returned to Iowa and was the Kraft Soda distributor in Keokuk for many years and owner and operator of the Keokuk Barrel Company. He served on the board of directors of the Security State Bank and was an inheritance tax appraiser for twenty years.

Mr. Hart was a longtime member of the Salvation Army and of the Keokuk Rotary Club. He was an active member of St. John's Episcopal Church where he served as a vestryman, junior and senior warden, and delegate or alternate delegate to the Diocesan Convention for twenty-five years. He also served one term as vice president of the Diocesan Convention, two times as member of the Council, as a member of the Executive Council of Province Six of the Northwest District, delegate to the General Convention in Miami in 1968, and as trustee of the Seabury Western Seminary at Evanston, Illinois. He was an honorary trustee of Seabury Seminary at the time of his death.

Republican, Stanley L. Hart was first elected to the Iowa Senate in 1936 to fill a vacancy. He was reelected in 1938, 1942, 1946 and 1950. He served as President pro tempore in the Fifty-first, Fifty-fourth and Fifty-fifth General Assemblies, and was a member of the Pioneer Lawyers.

Mr. Hart died at the Graham Hospital in Keokuk, Iowa, November 20, 1968. He is survived by his wife, Kathryn; one daughter, Marilyn Hart of Newport Beach, California; one son, Stanley Lawrence Hart II of Hamilton, Illinois; a brother, Elmer G. Hart of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, and five grandchildren.
