John W. Manley

John W. Manley was born on Nov. 3, 1908, son of the late John H. and Margaret Quirk Manley in Dyersville. He was a 1927 graduate of Xavier High School in Dyersville. He graduated from the University of Notre Dame Class of 1931 and receive his LLB degree from the University of Notre Dame Law School in 1933. He was admitted to the Iowa Bar in June 1933. Mr. Manley practiced law in Dyersville in the late 1930's. He was director of the school board and solicitor for the Dyersville City Council. In 1938 he was elected and served two terms in the Iowa State legislature as a State Representative from Dubuque County.

Mr. Manley worked for the Office of Price Administration in Washington, D.C. from 1942 to 1944 and in June 1944 he accepted a position with the Department of Justice in the Lands Division, remaining there until his retirement in 1975.

He was a member of St. Columbia Catholic parish, Oxon Hill, Md., Bishop Byrne Council #3877 of the Knights of Columbus, Notre Dame Club of Washington D.C., the Iowa Society of D.C., and the Mended Hearts Club. He was also an active member of the National Association of Retired Federal Employees and served several terms as 1st and 2nd Vice President of Chapter 1260. He was an honorary member of the Iowa Bar Association.

He married Alma Tegeler on Dec. 31, 1940 in Dyersville. He is survived by his wife and six children, Mary M. Boyce of Oxon Hill, Md., William B. Manley of LaPalma, Cal., Patricia M. Manley of Washington, D.C., Eileen M. Driscoll of Alexandria, Va., Gloria M. Allen of Raleigh, N.C., and Joanne G. Delahanty of Apple Valley, Minn. He is also survived by 11 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
