**Mr. Levi Jessup**, An old and highly respected citizen of this county, died at his residence in Marshall on the 13th inst. He had been unwell for some days, but not confined to his bed, and died suddenly while sitting in a chair—early in the morning of the 15th.

Mr. J. was a native of North Carolina from whence he removed to Hendricks Co. Indiana, which he twice represented in the Legislature of the State. He came to this County about 20 years ago, & was one term in the Legislature of this State. Although his age exempted him from military duty, yet he volunteered in the 8th Iowa Infantry (g. or boards) and served as long as his health and strength would permit. Ever an earnest advocate for liberty and justice to all men—strictly upright in all his dealings, kind and courteous in his intercourse with his fellow citizens, he leaves a large circle of warm friends to mourn his death.

**The 1st Iowa Cavalry** is at last mustered out, and the members have all reached their homes, except those who were discharged in Texas. This regiment has been in the service nearly five years, and has experienced the hardships of war in all its varied phases. It has won for itself a glorious record, and its reputation for discipline, bravery and patriotism stands second to none.
