Former Black Hawk County Treasurer Dewey S. Butterfield, 80, of 726 Home Park Blvd., died at 6:30 p.m. Monday of a stroke at Blake Memorial Hospital in Bradenton, Fla.

Funeral services will be arranged later in Waterloo. There will be a memorial service at Toale Mortuary in Bradenton Wednesday.

Mr. Butterfield was a life-long county resident. He was born March 10, 1898, in Cedar Falls.

He was an engineer for the Iowa State Highway Commission for seven years and then served 11 years as assistant county engineer. From 1941 to 1945

he was a representative in the Iowa Legislature, and served one term as a Waterloo City Councilman.

He was a World War I veteran.

Mr. Butterfield was in the insurance business in Waterloo for 15 years before being elected county treasurer in 1952. He retired as county treasurer on Dec. 31, 1973. He served on the Selective Service Board for many years and was a past president of the Iowa County Treasurer's Association. He was the first president of the Masonic Lodge 125 and was awarded a 50-year membership in 1970.

Surviving are his wife, Florence; a sister, Hazel Butterfield of Topeka, Kan.; and a brother, Glade Butterfield of Dallas, Texas.
