Alfred F. Lage, 88, Blackhawk Hotel, Davenport, former state representative and county supervisor, died Tuesday at Americana Nursing Center, Davenport.

Mr. Lage was elected state representative in 1942. He was elected to the Scott County Board of Supervisors in 1944 and became chairman in 1946.
