# Star athlete, politician dies

Ted P. Sloane, 81, a prominent Iowa politician, Des Moines divorce lawyer and legendary 1920s football star at Drake University, died Friday of cancer in Boca Raton, Fla., where he had lived since retiring in 1969.

No memorial services are planned and the body will be cremated.

Born in West Des Moines, Mr. Sloan was an All-State

football player for Valley High School and was named All-American in 1923, the same year Red Grange of Illinois won the same honor.

As a 156-pound end, Mr. Sloane frequently played without a helmet and could "bowl over" players nearly twice his size, said C. Edwin Moore, former chief justice of the Iowa Supreme Court and a Drake fraternity brother of Mr. Sloane's.

During his 39 years of legal practice in Des Moines, Mr. Sloane became one of the state's premier domestic court lawyers and handled the divorces of some of Des Moines' most prominent citizens.

Mr. Sloane served five terms in the Iowa House of Representatives from 1943 to 1953. He also served as secretary to late Des Moines Mayor Parker L. Crouch in 1930 and 1931 and was a member of the Drake University coaching staff from 1923 to 1931.

He has been hailed as one of Drake's most famous football players, selected on the university's "1920-30 football team of the decade" and recognized as one of Drake's all-time great athletes in 1960.

He was a member of the Iowa and Polk County bar associations, the first treasurer of Polk County Young Republican Club, a member of St. John's Lutheran Church, Za-Ga-Zig Shrine and a Scottish Rite Thirty-second degree Mason. He also served as vice president general counsel at Pictures Productions Inc. At the time of his retirement, he was a partner in the law firm of Pewers, Sloane, Jordan, Marks, Flagg and Hockett.

Survivors include his wife, Eleanor; two children, Ted of San Jose, Calif., and Mary McCarty of Birmingham, Ala.; two brothers, Earl of Boca Raton, Fla., and Luke of Texas; and two granddaughters.


Mr. Blessing was born in Missouri and lived most of his life in the Knoxville area. He was a retired farmer.
