Services for Walter Salomon, 89, of Clarinda, were held Monday morning at St. John Lutheran Church. The Rev. Carl M. Lueker officiated and burial was in the Clarinda Cemetery.

Funeral bearers were Melvin Audenberg, Thad Hurst, Merle Parker, Robert Rucker, Fred Sump and Amos Wagoner. Honorary bearers were Louis E. R. Walter, Bartels, Albert Langgarten, Paul Kuehnert, Robert Sunderman and Ernest Simpson. Mrs. Duaine Wagoner was in charge of the music, and Mrs. Lyle Eden was in charge of the register.

Mr. Salomon died Thursday at St. Heights Manor. He was born Nov. 24, 1893, at his parents' home north of Clarinda, the son of Christian and Minna (Holtz) Salomon. He was baptized Dec. 18, 1893, and confirmed April 12, 1903, at Immanuel Lutheran Church. He attended Immanuel Lutheran parochial school, and City Business College at Clarinda. After graduation he worked for a bank in South Dakota, and returned to farming at Clarinda in the early 1920s.

Mr. Salomon was the field tax assessor for Nodaway Township surrounding area for 40 years. He was united in marriage to Freida Leistner Sept. 9, 1926, at United Lutheran Church. She preceded him in death Dec. 23, 1969.

He is survived by a son, Walter West Des Moines, and a daughter, Mrs. Wayne Elnora of Clarinda, four granddaughters, two grandsons and one great-granddaughter.

Preceding him in death were his parents, wife, two sisters and two brothers.

Clarinda Memorial Chapel has been in charge of arrangements.

Fulk campaign Headquarters on Thursday morning, and was having noon lunch with his son at his Country Club Apartment home when he had a massive stroke. He died at the Municipal Hospital in mid-afternoon.

His health had caused him to be inactive during recent years, but he had continued to care for his own apartment after the death of his wife on March 28, 1974. He is survived by two daughters, Wilma (Mrs. LaVern Sawyer) of Supulveda, Ca and Marilyn (Mrs. Jim Crain) of Clarinda. Living sons include Marvin of Newport, Ark; Lyle of Hamburg, and Kenneth of Clarinda with family residence at Des Moines.

He had 22 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. Ray Fulk, 83, of Elsinore, Calif, is a brother whom he visited in recent months.

Mr. Fulk was born on a farm northwest of Shambaugh on May 29, 1890, to Henry and Barbara Beery Fulk. When he was 10, his mother died and the family moved to Shambaugh. When he had completed the 8th grade at Linn Point School, his teacher made it possible for him and two others to have a special class and have their 9th year.

Mr. Fulk worked on farms, attended Amity College one year, and married Mrs. M. Duncan whom he married on Nov. 22, 1911.

Paul Albert Lucas, 55, son of James Lester and Josephine Sullivan Lucas was born at Chillicothe, Mo. on Oct 21, 1920. He died Thursday at the Hand County Hospital at Shenandoah, following a brief illness.

Services were held Saturday from Hackett Funeral Home with Rev L P Fitzpatrick officiating. Organist was Mrs Margaret Woods. Military services were conducted at the Elmwood Cemetery at Coin by the Harris-Flowers Legion Post 568 and Co E 168th Infantry Iowa National Guard. Casket bearers were William Alexander, James Davis, Glen Hull, Kenneth Simbro, Paul Sturm and Larry Swinford.

His early years were at Chillicothe, the family moving to Coin where he grew and was graduated from Coin High school. On July 6, 1942, he answered the call of his country, serving until Dec 21, 1945, during World War II with the 763rd Tank Battalion. He returned to Coin where he was employed by the Babash railroad, later the Norfolk and Western Railroad where he became a section foreman.

Preceding him in death was his father.

He leaves a son, James, and three grandchildren, of Moorhead, Minn. His mother is Mrs ten (Josephine) Brattain, and sister Vera Adams of Coin.

Three step sisters are Mrs Ralph (Romena) Hicks of Coline, Ill, Mrs Emil (Loretta) Lawton of Weirton, W Va and Mrs Robert (Colleen) Ernst of San Diego, Calif.

An aunt, uncle and cousin from Kansas City were also in attendance at the service.

From 1906 to 1910, he was clerk and assistant cashier of the Shambaugh Savings Bank.

After their marriage, the couple moved to the farm 1 and one half miles northwest of Shambaugh where their eight children were born. Three of the children preceded him in death.

Robert, the eldest, who was 10; the second son Ermal, when he was 2; and another son when he was a few days old.

Mr Fulk was the first person appointed to the Page County Selective Service System prior to World War II, and, except for the time he was in the Legislature, was on the committee for over 25 years.

He was on the school board for many years, township clerk, township trustee, on the election board, Farm Bureau Board, director of the Shambaugh Telephone Company, measured farms for the Corn-Hog program, Triple A, Soil Conservation- the kinds of community activities that represent at least 200 years of service.

His community service included being president of the Page County Farm Bureau for 6 years and in the Iowa House of Representatives for four years. He was president of the Page County Angus Assn. He had a purebred herd of Angus and was one of those who formed the original group of Angus breeders in this area.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon at Trinity United Presbyterian Church with the Rev Wayne Fisher officiating. H E Richardson was soloist and Mrs Helen Hall Hoskinson organist. Clytha Pollett was at the register, Chester Olenius and Stanley Stimson were ushers.

Honorary bearers were: Ross Calhoon, Earl Woods, Harry Rucker, Neil Johnston, Ben Goecker, J H Stimson and Clark McKeown. Casket bearers were: Roger Fulk, Jed Fulk, Rick Olson, Roger Roach, Jay Dee Crain and Jac Crain.
