STROKE FATAL TO CLINT FLETCHER, ONCE LEGISLATOR

Ocheyedan Man Dies After Hospitalization; Funeral This Friday

Clint Fletcher, Ocheyedan, died Tuesday morning at the Osceola Community Hospital in Sibley, where he had been a patient since Dec. 31. Mr. Fletcher had suffered three strokes.

Funeral services are tentatively scheduled this Friday at 2 p.m. at the Ocheyedan Methodist Church, with burial in the Ocheyedan Cemetery. Masonic rites will be in charge of Silver Cord Lodge, Ocheyedan.

Mr. Fletcher, a Republican, was a former state representative from Osceola County, serving two terms, 1945 through 1948. From 1949 until 1963 he was a member of the Osceola County Board of Assessment and Review.

Clinton Leslie Fletcher was born May 23, 1887, on a farm southeast of Ocheyedan, to Thomas Bruse and Isabelle Moore Fletcher. He spent most of his life farming.

He was married June 6, 1917, at Des Moines to Sarah Belle Morton. They had no children. She died April 2, 1964.

He served in the U. S. Navy during World War I. He was a

member of the American Legion, Masons, Order of Eastern Star and Methodist Church.

Survivors include a sister, Mrs. Gladys Gardner, Fon Du Lac, Wis.; a brother, Lyle Long Beach, Calif.; two sisters-in-law Mrs. Sylvia Morton, Sibley, and



Mrs. Harriet Fletcher, Cameron, Mo., and several nieces and nephews.

Mrs. Claudine McAninch lived with the Fetters the past 12 years, assisting in the care of Mrs. Fletcher until her death and Mr. Fletcher.
