Rites Friday for Oscar Hultman Former Member State Legislature

STANTON—Funeral services for Oscar N. Hultman, 81, former Iowa State Senator and State Representative and a lifetime resident of Stanton, will be Friday, Sept. 19, at 2 p.m. at Mamrelund Lutheran Church.

The body will lie in state from 1 to 2 p.m.

Officiating at the services will be the Rev. Francis W. Johnson of Stanton and the Rev. Fred Jansson of Wakefield, Neb., formerly of Stanton. Burial will be in Mamrelund Cemetery and arrangements are in charge of Nelson Chapel, Red Oak.

Mr. Hultman died Sunday, Sept. 14, at his summer home on a ranch near Moose, Wyo. Funeral services were held at Moose at Chapel of the Transfiguration.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. August Hultman, he was born Nov. 2, 1887, at Stanton and was a graduate of Stanton High School with the Class of 1905. After graduation from high school he was employed by a lumber firm here, later becoming a partner and for many years he has been sole owner of the firm, now Hultman Lumber Co. He was active as Manager until his death.

Former Mayor

Mr. Hultman was a World War I Army veteran and served as Mayor and a member of the Town Council here. He was in the Iowa Legislature from 1932 to 1936 and is credited with the locating of Viking Lake State Park near here.


A charter member of Stanton's Ernie Johnson Post of The American Legion, he was a member of Mamrelund Lutheran Church and had served as Building Chairman, was a member of Tarkio Lodge of the Masons, Za-Ga-Zig Lodge of the Shrine, Des Moines, was a member of Iowa Pioneer Lawmakers Association and had served that organization as Vice-President.

Surviving are his wife, Lola; two sons, Donald of Bellevue, Wash., and Calvin, Red Oak; three grandchildren.
