**Services For Orville Olson**

Orville J. Olson, 72, Hackensack, MN, died Friday, Feb. 14, at the Good Samaritan nursing home, Pine River, MN.

Born Jan. 9, 1914 in Harpers Ferry, he was a cabinet maker until moving to the Hackensack area in 1950. He was a resident of the Hackensack area for 35 years, owning and operating the Twin Springs resort on Pleasant Lake while continuing his cabinet making trade. He served on the Pleasant Lake association board of directors for eight years, was a supervisor on the Birch Lake town board for 12 years, was a member of the Hackensack Senior Citizens' club, serving as president for four years, and vice-president for one year, and also served on the Cass County Council on Aging for five years.

He is survived by his wife, the former Dolores Lansing of Ossian; his mother, Mrs. Ida Olson, of Waukon; a sister Mrs. Oscar (Amy) Ferris of Burlington, and three brothers, Alton, Helmer and Lloyd, all of Harpers Ferry.

Services were held at 1 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 18, at Sacred Heart Catholic church, Hackensack, with the Rev. Tom Bouchard officiating. Burial was in the Hillcrest cemetery, Hackensack.

Lifelong area resident Attorney Arthur H. Jacobson, 75, died Friday, Feb. 21 at Methodist hospital in Rochester, MN. Services were held Tuesday, Feb. 25 at 11 a.m. at St. John's Lutheran church with the Rev. Lynn Groe officiating.

He was born June 24, 1910 to Gustav and Gustava (Blilie) Jacobson in Waukon. He was a graduate of Waukon high school, Waukon junior college, the University of Iowa with a bachelor of arts degree and a juris doctor (law) degree with high distinction. He was elected to the Order of the COIF at the University of Iowa.

He married Isabel Chafer September 15, 1934 in Macon, MO.

Survivors include his wife; a daughter Sibyl of New York City; a son Ethan of Lakewood, CO; a daughter-in-law, Gloria, and two grandchildren, Darren and Nicole.

He was preceded in death by a half-sister, Corene Yelverton.

He had been a state senator for eight years; was active in the Republican party; was president of Farmers and Merchants Savings bank; member of the county and state bar associations; former member of the board of governors of the State Bar association; member of the county and state Association of Trial Lawyers; local and national board of directors of the Good Samaritan society; former member of the national council of the American Lutheran church; member of the LCUSA of the Lutheran Church of the U.S.A.; former state president of Lutheran Social services, and a partner in the law firm of Jacobson, Bristol, Thomson, Bauercamper and Garrett in Waukon.

Burial was in Oakland cemetery with Martin funeral home in charge of the arrangements.
