**Charles J. Knickerbocker, 95**, a former Fairfax area resident, died Friday in the Iowa Masonic Nursing Home at Bettendorf following a sudden illness.



Born April 24, 1883, in Fairfax, he was preceded in death by his first wife, Edith Ross Knickerbocker, in 1945. Mr. Knickerbocker was married to Maud H. Tindall in July, 1946. They lived in Fort Meyers, Fla., from 1961 to 1978, when they became residents of the Iowa Masonic Home at Bettendorf.

Mr. Knickerbocker was engaged in farming and the breeding of Belgian and Percheron horses. He was a member of St. John's Episcopal Church, Fidelitas Lodge No. 364 AF & AM, Fairfax, Cedar Rapids Consistory, El Kahir Shrine, past member of the Iowa State Fair Board on which he served for 16 years, past director of the Linn County Farm Bureau and of the Linn County Fair Association. Mr. Knickerbocker served two terms in the Iowa State Legislature. A Republican, he was representative for Linn County in the 52nd General Assembly in 1946 through 1947. A 1905 graduate of Iowa State, he was a charter member of the Ames Chapter of Kappa Sigma Fraternity.

Surviving in addition to his wife are two sons, Ross E. of Manitou Springs, Colo., and Col. W.J. of Lakewood, Colo.; a daughter, Mrs. R.A. Packard of Winston Salem, N.C.; two stepsons, Robert Tindall of Oak Park, Ill., and Howard D. Tindall of Texas; seven grandchildren; and 12 great-grandchildren.
