Iowa City Resident, Was Retired As Carpenter Contractor

Large Henry Miller, 79, died Tuesday at his home at 703 Iowa street after a short illness.

He had lived in Iowa City for the last five years, and for 16 years was an employe of the University of Iowa.

Miller was born on a farm in Iowa county, April 8, 1869, the son of George and Hannah Fessler.

He was a carpenter and contractor for 36 years.

He was married to Effie Simms in Iowa City in 1900. She died 13 years ago. Mr. Miller was a member of the Odd Fellow lodge for 48 years and had served as past noble.

Surviving are a son, George, of Iowa City; two daughters, Mrs. Rayman, Ottumwa, and Mrs. Edna E. Stitzell, Des Moines; and others, John Emmons, Colo., and Sam J. Miller, Columbus; a sister, Mrs. Mary Miller, Iowa City, and four children. Two sons preceded him in death.

Rev. Donavan G. Hart will officiate at the funeral which will be held at 2 p. m. Thursday at the St. Michael's funeral chapel. Burial will be in Riverside.

State Rep. Frank Krall, 64, Dies After Long Illness

State Representative Frank J. Krall, 64, Iowa City, died at Mercy hospital at 4 a. m. today after an illness of many months.

A retired farmer and resident at 402 North Dodge street, he entered the hospital Monday and lapsed into a coma late Tuesday. He observed his 64th birthday last Thursday.

Only six days ago Representative Krall announced that because of ill health he would not be a candidate for re-election to the legislature in the November general election.

He intended, however, to serve the rest of his term, which was to expire in January.

Born in Graham township, Mr. Krall lived and farmed in that and Newport townships nearly all his life. He retired March 1, 1946, and moved to Iowa City.

Formerly a rural school teacher for four years, he served as township assessor and clerk, as a member of a rural school board, was a township director of the Farm Bureau and a member of the Johnson county board of education for eight years. A Democrat, he was elected to the legislature in 1946.

He served on the Johnson county board of supervisors from 1933 to 1941. He was a fourth degree member of the Knights of Columbus, a member of the Moose lodge, Iowa City Chamber of Commerce and St. Wenceslaus church.

Surviving him are his widow; three daughters, Mrs. Dorothy Lacinia, Mrs. Bernice Gough, both of Iowa City, Mrs. Marion Knowling, Sharon.

Four sons, Ralph J., Donald, Joseph, all of Iowa City, Richard, West Branch; four brothers, Fred, Cedar Rapids, John, Fairfax, Jim, Sioux Falls, S.D., George, Iowa City.

Six sisters, Mrs. Agnes Kouba, Mrs. Emma Schindler, both of Cedar Rapids, Mrs. Margaret Esser, Seattle, Wash., Mrs. Lottie Kasper, Mrs. Mary Fraizer, both of Iowa City, and Mrs. Lydia Faunce, Detroit, Mich.; and nine grandchildren.

The body will remain at the McGovern funeral home until the time of funeral services, to be held at 9 a. m. Friday at St. Wenceslaus church. Burial will be in St. Joseph's cemetery.

The rosary will be recited at 8 p. m. Thursday at the funeral home.
