MAURICE M. NEAL

Maurice Marshall Neal
was born to Swain and
Nellie Neal on January 30,
1900 near Dexter, Iowa.
Four years later they moved
to a farm west of Dexter in
Guthrie County. It remained
their family farm until 1921.
He was educated in the
Dexter schools, graduating
from high school in 1918.
He later attended Iowa
State College in the
S.A.T.C.

On September 3, 1927 he
was married to Zedonna
Rawson. To this union five
children were born.

Maurice was a community
minded citizen, serving as
mayor, councilman and on
the Board of Education,
both locally and at a county
level. He served one term
in the State Legislature as a
representative in 1947. He
was appointed Dexter post-
master in 1952 and served
for 16 years before retiring
in 1968. He was a veteran
of World War I.

He leaves to mourn his
passing his wife Zedonna of
Dexter; four sons, Robert
Rawson of Dexter, Craig M.
of Orient, Richard D. of Des
Moines and James S. of
Nokesville, Virginia; one
daughter, Emily E. Sul-
grove of Dexter; 17 grand-
children, and eight great
grandchildren.

He was an elder in the
Presbyterian Church, a fifty
year member of the Mas-
sonic Lodge and Eastern
Star and a member of Za-
ka-Zig Shrine. He leaves a
host of friends and will be
deeply missed by all of us.

Funeral services were
conducted March 22, 1983
at the First United Presby-
terian Church in Dexter,
Iowa, with the Rev. A. J.
Bosman officiating. Ken-
neth Shepherd provided vo-
cal music accompanied by
Nadine Shepherd at the or-
gan. Pallbearers were Ste-
ven Neal, Gregg Neal, Louis
Neal, Randall Neal, Philip
Neal, Douglas Neal, Ted
