Tire tracks for several hundred feet on the shoulder, starting at the curve area, indicate Machovec's car may have partially missed the curve, officials said. The vehicle apparently traveled some distance with two wheels on the shoulder before going down the embankment into the lake.

County officials are discussing an appeal to the Iowa Highway Commission for installation of reflectors or a guard rail at this location to give added notice of the curve.

1965 to the Sunnyview Retire-
ment Home at Rockwell City
and then later moved to
Friendship Haven in Fort
Dodge.
