He was born Jan. 4, 1915, at Evanston, Ill., the son of Ernest and Lois Bloomer Johnson Palmer Sr. He married Sue Waldron. She survives.

He was an attorney. He was a graduate of Amherst College, 1932-36, Stanford University Law School, Northwestern University and was an attorney for 58 years. He was a U.S. Navy Lt. Commander in World War II, was a past president of the Fort Madison Chamber of Commerce, past president of the Community Chest, at state representative for six years, a gubernatorial candidate, the chairman of Trustees and Building Drive at the Union Presbyterian Church and a trustee at Parsons College.

At Winnetka, Ill., he was a member and elder of the Winnetka Presbyterian Church and chair of the Building Drive and Canvass, he was a trustee of the Lake Forest Academy, a life trustee at Lawrence Hall and recipient of the Gene Meier Award. He was a Cub fan, a friend to many and a man with the common touch.

Besides his wife, he is survived by two sons, Ernest III (wife Donna), Glenview, Ill. and Waldron, Sarasota, Fla.; three daugh-
