



RAY E. AND GLADYS SHEPARD

Ray E. Shepard was born on a farm in Appanoose County January 25, 1895, the son of David D. and Nancy Jane (Brown) Shepard. The family moved to Lucas County in 1910.

As a young man, he was asked by a neighbor to pick up Aunt Gladys Van Arsdale at the train depot in Russell. To his surprise, Aunt Gladys was an attractive young schoolteacher from Blandinsville, Illinois. Their courtship was postponed when Ray enlisted for the Army and volunteered for the American Expeditionary Forces in World War I and served in France. After a long-distance courtship by mail, they were married on her 23rd birthday in 1919 and lived in Chariton where Ray was sales manager of an automobile agency.

In 1935 Ray was appointed deputy sheriff of Lucas County by Miles Mason and served two terms. In 1939 he was elected sheriff and served three terms with Paul Laing, his deputy. During these six years, it was Gladys' job to

serve meals to jail prisoners.

Ray then served four terms as Republican state representative representing Lucas County. He was chairman of the Mines and Mining Commission. At the same time, Ray also operated Shepard Shellgas Service until his health failed. He died on May 27, 1964.

He was Presbyterian Church elder, past commander of the American Legion Post, member of A.F. & A.M., I.O.O.F., K.P., and Iowa State Sheriff's Association.

Gladys enjoyed social functions including Presbyterian Women, American Legion Auxiliary, Chariton Women's Club, was a charter member of the Chariton Garden Club and a 50-year member of Eastern Star.

She missed being 100 years old by a few months, living from October 9, 1896, to June 21, 1996. They are buried in the Russell Cemetery near his parents and sisters.

Ernest T. Smith was born September 12, 1887, in Volga, Iowa. He was a graduate of Volga High School, and graduated from Upper Iowa University, in Fayette, in 1913.

In June, 1916, he was married to Miss Roberta Baskerville of Earlville. They lived in North Dakota for 12 years, where Mr. Smith was a school superintendent for eight years. In 1923 they moved to Iowa, where he operated a general merchandise store in Volga for eight years. In 1932 he moved his family to a farm south of town, where he lived at the time of his death.

Mr Smith was an active worker in the Methodist Church, serving nearly 40 years as church treasurer. He also was a Sunday School teacher and superintendent for several years. He served many years as secretary of the Volga School Board, was a Sperry Township Justice of the Peace, and a charter member of the Iowa State Dairy Industry Commission. 
