## Helen Crabb, 85 died in Arizona

Former Lake Panorama and Jamaica resident Helen Crabb, 85, of Green Valley, AZ died August 15 there. No public services were held with the cremains placed in a mortuary.

She was an early and active supporter of Lake Panorama, later serving as an employee of the Lake Panorama Association and on its board of directors. Prior to that, she represented Guthrie County for two terms in the Iowa House of Representatives, served six years on and chaired the Iowa State Conservation Commission (now DNR) and was president of the Iowa Federation of Women's Clubs.

Surviving are her husband, John of Green Valley; one son, James of Tucson, AZ; and two grandchildren.

The worry-free date for voters to register by mail for the upcoming school board elections is Monday, August 26. Registrations postmarked on or before this day are considered on time, even if they are received after 5 p.m. on August 30.

Voter registrations delivered to the county auditor's office or done in person must be completed on or before 5 p.m. Friday, August 30. The office is open weekdays 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

"The impaired waters list is a true measure of our water quality in Iowa nor is it an indication of how much progress we have made from list to list. There are 1,000 waters in the state that could be on the list but we simply do not have the resources necessary to include them," said the Water Quality Bureau Director. "In addition, some waters on the list are not impaired. This is not necessarily a reflection of some of the waterbodies that have relatively good water quality and support healthy aquatic life."
