Thomas J. Dailey



Thomas J. Dailey, 75, of 516 South St., died Thursday, Feb. 22, 1990, at Burlington Medical Center.

Born June 12, 1914, in Burlington, he was

the son of Thomas F. and Grace McCaffrey Dailey.

Dailey graduated from Burlington Junior College in 1934, the University of Iowa in 1936 and the Columbus Law School, Catholic University, Washington, D.C., in 1940. He also received a master's degree from Catholic University in 1949.

He was a Navy veteran of World War II. He participated in the North African campaign of 1943 and the invasions of Italy and Sicily. In 1944, he was in the Pacific amphibious forces that invaded the Philippines and Borneo.

He was Burlington City Attorney from 1946 to 1948. He was a lawyer with Dailey, Ruther, Bauer, Schultz, Hahn, Swanson and Crowley, retiring in 1985.

Dailey was elected to the Iowa Senate in 1951, where he served for eight years. He also served on the party's State Central Committee from 1961 to 1966. In 1958, he challenged Republican Congressman Fred Schwengel, losing by a narrow margin.

He was a member of St. Patrick's Catholic Church and a life member of the Knights of Columbus and Des Moines County Crippled Children's Association.

Surviving are several cousins, an aunt and an uncle.

The rosary will be recited at 7:30 p.m. Sunday at Prugh's Chapel.

A memorial mass for Mr. Dailey will be 9:30 a.m. Monday at St. Patrick's Catholic Church with Fr. Michael Phillips officiating. Burial will be in Sacred Heart Cemetery. The body has been prepared.

Union on
'watch list'**

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. — The State Board of Education today listed 181 of the state's 968 school districts on a "watch list" of districts that might be headed for serious financial difficulty.

Dallas City and Union schools are included on the watch list.

The list, including nearly 20 percent of Illinois school districts, reflects the financial condition of schools in the fiscal year that ended June 30, and doesn't account for additional money schools received from last year's income tax increase.

"The increased revenue from the income tax provided desperately needed assistance for school districts, but does not come close to offsetting the state's past neglect of education funding that has really taken its toll on local schools," said state Education Superintendent Robert L. ...

Former state Senator Dailey dies of cancer

BURLINGTON, IA. (AP) — Tom Dailey, a former state senator from Burlington, died of cancer Thursday. He was 75.

Harold Hughes, a former Iowa governor and former U.S. senator, described Dailey as "a very fine man and a wonderful statesman."

Dailey, a retired lawyer, got his political start in 1928 when he canvassed Burlington neighborhoods for presidential candidate Al Smith.

He served in the Iowa Senate for eight years in the 1950s, ran unsuccessfully for Congress in 1958 and was a member of the Democratic Party's state central committee from 1961 to 1966.

"He's someone whose support I valued over the years," said Secretary of State Elaine Baxter of Burlington. "He advised me as I grew up in politics, and I was glad to have his advice."

Dailey had cancer of the pancreas and the lung, said Edward Dailey, his cousin and former law partner.

A memorial service will be at 9:30 a.m. Monday at St. Patrick's Catholic Church. Burial of the ashes will be in Sacred Heart Cemetery.

He has no immediate survivors.
