George Fiene Mourned

George Fiene, a Democrat who was elected to two terms in the Iowa House of Representatives from Chickasaw county in the days when the job usually went to a Republican, died suddenly November 29 at the home of his son, Wendell, in El Cajon, Ca. He was 89. Death was attributed to a heart attack.

Funeral services, largely attended, were held at 2 p.m. Sunday from the United Methodist church, the Rev. Robert Lemmermann, the pastor, officiating. Burial was beside his wife in Greenwood cemetery.

Mrs. Nelda Shepard was organist.

Casket bearers were Carl Smith, jr., Edward Harris, Eugene Moine, Wilbur Eckenrod, Roger Richards and Norbert Ganschow.

Honors also were accorded by Bradford Lodge, A.F. & A. M., with Harry Endres acting as chaplain.

George lived alone for some years following the death of his wife in 1958, but in recent years divided his time in residing with his son, Wendell, in California, and a daughter, Mrs. Dorothy Prudhon, of Evansville, Wi.

GEORGE FIENE was born September 4, 1883, near the once bustling village of Republic and lived there and in Nashua most of his life.

He attended Barber rural school, an academy in New Hampton, and Iowa State Teacher's College at Cedar Falls, now UNI.

He was married to Pearl Yates June 1, 1907. To this union were born three children; Wendell, Claude and Dorothy. He was preceded in death by 10 brothers and sisters; a son, Claude, in 1913, and wife, Pearl, in 1958.

He leaves to mourn his passing his son, Wendell, of El Cajon, Ca., daughter, Dorothy of Evansville, Wi., five grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; one sister, Mrs. Margaret Eisenhart of Los Angeles, Ca., and nieces, nephews and a host of friends.

He retired from the farm and moved to Nashua in 1944.

He served as clerk of the Barber School and as Richland Township assessor for many years. Later, he was elected State Representative of Chickasaw County for two terms. He was active in promoting the Big Four Fair and was a board member.

He was a member of the Nashua Methodist Church, Eastern Star and the Bradford Masonic Lodge.

MEASLES ONLY vaccine will be given children third grade up to and including age 12 (6th grade) and combined measles-Rubella vaccine will be given one year through second grade, the doctor said.

A statement issued by the Medical Society says:

"If your child has either had or been vaccinated against MEASLES. Since 1967, revaccination will not be needed except as follows: If you are uncertain about whether your child has been vaccinated or had the disease, vac-

inate again! If your child was vaccinated before his first birthday, or given gamma globulin along with the vaccine, the vaccine may not have taken. In this case, also, it would be a good idea to **vaccinate again.** (If the vaccination involved only one shot, it probably did not include gamma globulin. If you are still uncertain about this point, check with your doctor or **vaccinate again.**)

REMEMBER, MEASLES vaccine protects against MEASLES ("Red" Measles, "hard" Measles, "8 day" Measles) only. It does not protect against German Measles ("3 day" Measles, "Rubella"). The County-wide vaccination campaign held in 1970 was for German Measles only. Children through the 2nd grade will receive the combined Rubella (Measles), Rubella (3 day Measles) vaccine unless you indicate from your records at home that they participated in the Rubella Campaign in 1970 or have been immunized in your Family Doctor's office. Children in 3rd through 12th grades will receive Measles vaccine only.

MEASLES CAN RESULT in severe complications such as pneumonia or encephalitis. You owe it to your child to make arrangements to have him vaccinated.
