## Fay L. Harris Died Thursday

After a prolonged illness Fay L. Harris, well-known, life-long resident of Adair County passed away at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, May 19 at the Greenfield Manor, where he was admitted two days earlier after being released from the Greater Community Hospital in Creston.

A former Richland township farmer he had also been engaged in heavy earth moving construction. His wife Remie preceded him in death in 1946 and the following year he came to Greenfield. He served two terms in the Iowa State legislature as representative from Adair county from 1949-1952.

Surviving him are a son Bill of Creston; four grandchildren, two great grandchildren, a sister Mrs. India Spry of Wiota, and two brothers Merritt Harris of Earlham and Van Harris of Anita.

Visitation was held Friday evening at the Bickford-Murray Funeral Home, and family and friends paid parting respects to Mr. Harris at graveside rites in the Greenfield Cemetery held at two o'clock Saturday afternoon, May 21. The Rev. Alfred Clark conducted the service.

The pallbearers were Freeman Brown, Don Harris, Jack Harris, Raymond Harris, Roy Harris, and Ted Harris.
