

Henry E. Heideman, son of Herman E. and Laura Kathryn Barkmeier Heideman, was born December 23, 1889 at Danforth, Illinois and passed away at Rochester, Minnesota, on November 7, 1978 at the age of 88 years, 10 months and 15 days.

At the age of seven Mr. Heideman moved with his parents to Harvey, Illinois where he attended school. On June 30, 1910 he was united in marriage with Lillian Robinson. Following their marriage they lived in Harvey, where Mr. Heideman owned and operated a coal and feed business for a number of years. In 1946 they moved to the Rockwell City, Iowa area where he was engaged in farming for a number of years. Mr. Heideman served in the Iowa Senate from 1952 until 1956. He had been active in the Rotary International while living in Harvey and he has been presented the Silver Beaver Award by the Boys Scouts of America. He was a member of the Rockwell City Lions Club, Calhoun County Historical Society and the United Methodist Church.

Preceding him in death were his parents, his wife in 1973, one brother and three sisters. He is survived by two daughters, Evelyn (Mrs. Ray Davis) of Steger, Illinois and Mary (Mrs. Weston Thompson) of Rockwell City; one son, George of Eldorado Hills, California; 12 grandchildren; 11 great-grandchildren; one sister, Mrs. Laura Huston of Park Forest South, Illinois and other relatives and friends.

Hazel Laura Lohr, the daughter of Fannie Barr Barton, was born November 13, 1892, at Manteno, Kankakee County, Illinois, and departed this life on November 10, 1978, at the Stewart Memorial Home, Lake City, Iowa. She lived her life for 85 years, 10 months, and 25 days.

Hazel graduated from Joliet High School in Joliet, Illinois and later attended the State Teacher's College at Rockwell City, Iowa. During her teaching career she worked at Cresco, Jefferson, and Lohrville. On April 21, 1920, Miss Hazel was united in marriage to Mr. John Lohr at their parent's home in Lohrville. They were born five children, Howard of Lohrville, Jane (Mrs. Taylor) of Ewa Black, Hawaii (Mrs. Walter Phelps) of Waverly, Iowa, Lora (Mrs. Francis Holland) of Lohrville, Iowa. After their marriage they lived on their present homesite where they farmed all of their life. Hazel died in Lohrville, Iowa, on October 10, 1977 and in Lohrville, Iowa, on November 10, 1978, at the Shady Center in Lake City where she died of her recent illness.
