Fayette To Have New Grade School Constructed Soon

FAYETTE — A new elementary school will be constructed here to replace a 100-year-old structure, as a result for a successful \$275,000 bond election Monday,

Voters of the Fayette Community district approved the new school by 496 to 110 in the balloting Monday. That was a favorable margin of 81.4 percent.

Officials say they hope the new school can be constructed by the second semester of next year. The new structure will be located on school property southeast of the present high school building.

It will enable the district to move elementary students out of an old stucco building which was constructed in 1866.

To make room for the new structure, the old high school industrial arts building will be razed. The building has been condemned and has not been in use for two years.


Republicans Planning Celebration For Fourth

In addition to his community work, he farmed and was engaged in masonry work in the Eldorado vicinity. He was in good health until May 29, 1961, when he suffered a severe stroke from which he never completely recovered.
