Herman B. Lord, 89, 705 Marquette St., died Saturday afternoon at the Hershey Convalescent Home.

The son of Richard and Mary Neff Lord, he was born Aug. 21, 1893, in Orono Township, Muscatine County. He was a life resident of this area.

His marriage to Gertrude J. Klotz took place Dec. 10, 1917, in Muscatine. He was a member of the Wesley United Methodist Church, was past master and 50-year member of Iowa Lodge No. 2 and was a member of the KAABA Temple Shrine, Demolay Commandery, Webb Council No. 18, Knights of Pythias and the American Legion. He was a member of Battery C, having served during the Mexican uprising and was an officer in World War I. Mr. Lord had been mayor of Muscatine from 1932 to 1936, a state senator in the 1950s and was a former board member of Muscatine Power and Water. He had been executive vice president and general manager of the Muscatine Savings and Loan Co., now the Capitol Savings and Loan Co.

Survivors include one brother, Andrew of Muscatine, and one sister, Mrs. Alfred (Josephine) Bohling of Morning Sun.

He was preceded in death by his wife and an infant son.
