

L. D. Mallonee Dies; Lawyer Here 35 Yrs.

L. D. Mallonee, 72, prominent Audubon attorney, died June 13 at the Audubon County Memorial Hospital. He had been in failing health for several years.

Mr. Mallonee is survived by his wife, Faye; one son, John, of Bradenton, Fla., and three grandsons.

A graduate of Simpson College and the University of Wisconsin, Mr. Mallonee formerly served as attorney for Audubon County, the City of Audubon, and the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad. A member of national, state and county bar associations, he was also a World War I veteran and an officer in the Iowa National Guard.

Mr. Mallonee came to Audubon in 1919 and practiced law until his health failed, in 1954. In 1950, the Audubon Chamber of Commerce named him "Man of the Year."

Funeral services were held Saturday from the First Methodist church, with burial in Maple Grove cemetery. A complete obituary appears elsewhere in this issue.
