Man Check Charges

AID REDUCED IN WELFARE CASES

Eighty-Five Nursing Care Patients Affected in Madison County

The reduction in state appropriations to the department of social welfare will go into effect July 1, and will result in sharply lower assistance grants to 85 persons in Madison county, it was announced this week.

The reduction will amount to a total of \$6,918 in the annual payments made to these welfare recipients in Madison county.

A. A. Richards, chairman of the Madison county Welfare board, said this week that the lower assistance grant means a reduction in the allowances going to all categories of persons receiving nursing care, in a nursing home or elsewhere. The funds now available will be insufficient to continue the payments at their present rate.

All such grants are being reduced from \$5 to \$9 per month, depending on the individual case. The reduction will effect the amount allowed for clothing and miscellaneous personal expenses, and will not effect the amount allowed for nursing care.

Aid to dependent children cases are also being reduced on an average of 15 per cent.

OPTOMETRISTS PLAN SCREENING PROGRAM

Doctors George W. Lee and F. O. Winjum of Winterset are cooperating with the Iowa Optometric association in that group's special pre-school vision screening program to be held here on July 1.

Purpose of the state-wide program is to determine "visual readiness" of children who will be entering kindergarten this fall.


The two Winterset optometrists are both donating their services to the program. They will conduct the screenings in their own offices on Monday, July 1, and parents of pre-school children may call in advance for an appointment, or bring their children to the optometrists' offices at any time during office hours July 1.

Only those children who will be entering school for the first time this fall will be eligible to participate in the program. There will be no charge for the screenings.

The Winterset screenings are a part of a state-wide program intended to help children avoid the loss of a valuable year of school. Research programs have shown that as many as one out of four children have difficulty in learning to read and many

LAKEVIEW CLUB HANDICAP SUNDAY

Annual Tournament Scheduled For Members and Their Sons

The annual Club Handicap tournament at Lakeview Country club near Winterset will be held next Sunday for members and their sons.

Entrants must have at least five B-hole scores posted at the club to qualify. Handicaps will be based on 80 per cent of the difference between the average of each player's 10 best scores and par for the Lakeview course is 35.

For example, a player enters who has an average score of 45. As par is 35, the difference is 10 strokes. Eighty per cent of 10 is eight strokes. So the player's handicap would be eight strokes, and he would subtract that from each of his B-hole scores in the tournament.

An entry fee will be charged and prizes awarded to the 21 players with the lowest scores.

LORIN SAYRE OF WINTERSET DIES

Death Occurred on Sunday After Two Years of Illness

Lorin B. Sayre, one of Madison county's prominent citizens for many years died Sunday, June 23, at Madison county Memorial hospital in Winterset. He was 74 years of age, and had been ill since March of 1955.

Mr. Sayre was serving as state senator from the Madison-Adair district when he was stricken in 1955. He was a former Madison county superintendent of schools.

He was a son of Dr. S. N. and Anna Sayre, and was born at Marine on Oct. 18, 1882. The family moved to St. Charles in 1883, where much of his life was spent. He graduated from the St. Charles high school with the class of 1900, and taught several terms of school in and near there before engaging in the mercantile business. Later he returned to the teaching profession on a part time basis, while he attended Des Moines university, where he took his B. A. degree.

This was followed by graduate study at the State University of Iowa in Iowa City.

He spent 33 years in the teaching profession. He served as teacher and superintendent of schools at St. Charles, Macksburg, Van Meter, Otho and Goldfield. He ended his teaching career with 12 years of service as Madison county superintendent of schools.

In 1952 he was elected state senator from the Madison-Adair district starting his term in 1953. He continued serving in this capacity until suffering a stroke in Des Moines in March, 1955. He entered Memorial hospital here in July 1955, and had been a patient at the hospital most of the time since that date.

Prior to his senate term, he had worked as bridge inspector on road work under the Madison county engineer's office.

He was married May 10, 1905, to Mabel Buchanan. They were parents of a daughter, Fae. Mrs. Sayre died in 1951. In addition to the daughter Mrs. Eldon Park-er of Albuquerque, N. Mex., he leaves two grandsons, and two sisters, Mrs. Nudie McVay of Des Moines and Mrs. Ethel Kessler of Iowa City.

He was a life-long and active member of the Methodist church. He was affiliated with the Winterset Rotary club, and served as delegate to the International convention in Mexico City in 1952.

Funeral services were held this Wednesday from the Winterset Methodist church, conducted by the pastor, the Rev. W. W. Steinmetz, assisted by the Rev. S. C. Picken, pastor of the Winterset United Presbyterian church. Burial was made in the St. Charles cemetery.

THOMAS J. B. ROBINSON

MR. PRESIDENT: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Thomas J. B. Robinson, begs leave to submit the following:

Thomas J. B. Robinson was born August 12, 1868, near New Diggings, Wisconsin, son of Isaac and Eliza Graham Robinson. He passed away on January 27, 1958, at Hampton, Iowa, where he had moved with his parents in 1870. He attended public school and was graduated from high school there, and then entered the banking business at the age of eighteen.

On June 15, 1888, he was united in marriage to Belle H. Clinton, a daughter of the Reverend John W. Clinton.

Mr. Robinson became the president of the Citizens National Bank of Hampton, director of the Coulter Savings Bank of Coulter, and a director of the Alexander Savings Bank of Alexander, Iowa. He was elected to the Iowa State Senate in 1912, representing the Forty-third District, and served during the Thirty-fifth and Thirty-sixth General Assemblies. He served as Congressman from the Third District of Iowa from 1923 until 1933, actively supporting the McNary-Haugen bill and other farm relief measures. He also served as president of the Hampton Library Board and was a trustee of Cornell College at Mount Vernon, Iowa. He was a member of the Hampton City Council, chairman of the Franklin County war activities during World War I, was a Mason and a Shriner.

Church activities were also among Mr. Robinson's interests. He was a member of the Methodist church, a delegate to general conferences of the Methodist church, Baltimore, Maryland, in 1908, Minneapolis, Minnesota, in 1912, and Saratoga Springs, New York, in 1916; he was a delegate to


