Funeral services were held Friday for former legislator William E. Darrington

William E. Darrington, 84 years, Persia, passed away last Tuesday evening in a local hospital following an apparent heart attack the day before. Born in Pottawattamie County, he has lived in the Persia/Neola area all his life, living and farming on the same farm for fifty-five years.

He attended Iowa State University. He was co-owner of the Persia Milling Company for twenty two years. After retirement, he still had an interest in the farming operations. He was a member of the Persia RLDS Church and the Farm Bureau. He was a Past Master of both Craftsman Lodge AF and AM in Persia and the Agate Lodge AF and AM in Neola, a member of the Scottish Rite 32 in Omaha and a Royal Arch Mason of Iowa.

He has been a director of the Home Savings Bank in Persia for forty five years. He served ten years on A.A.A., a farm program committee, and as a member of the Iowa House of Representatives representing Harrison County for eighteen years, serving as Chairman of the Transportation Committee for fourteen years and on several other committees. He was a charter member of the Board of Directors for the Harrison County Historical Village, later serving as President for a number of years.

After completing many years in the House of Representatives, he was

appointed by the Governor to serve on the Restoration Committee of Iowa's first Capital Building in Iowa City. The last year he served in the House of Representatives, he filed a resolution that started legislation to save the B.F. Allen and Hubbell Mansion from the wrecking ball. This property is now the Governor's Mansion known as Terrace Hill. He was a charter member and longtime member of the Restoration Committee.

His hobby of taking and showing 16mm pictures and traveling has taken him to over forty seven foreign countries. He and his wife, Mabel have been married fifty-five years.

Other survivors besides his wife, Mabel include one son, William W. of Persia; one daughter, Mrs. Raymond (Lola) Graalfs of Council Bluffs; four grandchildren; three great grandchildren; one brother, Howard E. Darrington of Neola; three sisters, Lillian E. Darrington of Council Bluffs, Ruth E. Anderson of Honey Creek and Ada E. Hall of Torrence, California; nieces and nephews. One sister, Pearl E. Pedersen preceded him in death.

Funeral services were held Friday at 10:30 a.m. at the Meyer Funeral Home Chapel. LeRoy Cave, pastor, Persia RLDS Church officiated. Interment was in the Grange Cemetery. Memorials may be made to the Harrison County Historical Village or to the Persia RLDS Church.
