Atom Physicist Dies

LIVERMORE, Calif. (AP) — Dr. Theodore C. Merkle, 47, a nationally known authority on nuclear reactor physics technology and an associate director of the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory in Livermore, died Friday of cancer. Merkle was on the staff of the laboratory since its inception in 1952. He was born in Toledo, Ohio.

Fred Ehlers Dies at 81

Fred J. Ehlers, 81, former state representative from Emmet county, mayor of Estherville for 12 years, and long-time Estherville merchant, died at 10:30 a.m. today at Holy Family hospital.

Mr. Ehlers came to Estherville in 1917 and was in the mercantile business here for 36 years, selling his store to Les McCleary in 1954.

He served as mayor of Estherville for 12 years, beginning in 1935, and declined to run for a seventh term after serving six. He was active in Republican politics, serving as county central committee chairman for eight years.

During World War II Mr. Ehlers was chairman of the USO in Emmet County. He was active in various local fund drives and headed the Cancer drive for several years. He was a member of Immanuel Lutheran Church.

Mr. Ehlers was elected Emmet county representative to the state legislature in 1954.

Funeral arrangements are being made at Reese-Henry Funeral Home in Estherville.

2 U.S. Warplanes Lost over North Viet Nam in Week's Toll

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — Two U.S. warplanes were shot down by Communist ground fire over North Viet Nam Friday, the U.S. military command announced today.

The losses raised to 13 the number of American planes downed this week, the highest weekly toll of the war.

It also boosted to 334 the total number U.S. aircraft reported lost over North Viet Nam since the air war began over the north.

An Air Force release said "two Air Force crews were downed by ground fire." There was no immediate explanation for the reference to crews, but a spokesman said the release obviously meant that two planes were lost.

The communique identified the planes as an F105 Thunderchief and an RF101 Voodoo reconnaissance plane. The crews were listed as missing.

North Viet Nam had claimed that six U.S. aircraft were shot down and "several air pirates captured."
