# Obituary

## Roscoe E. Greenwood, 80

Services were Thursday in Longmont, Colo. for Roscoe E. Greenwood, 80, of Longmont. He died last Monday at his home.

Greenwood was born on Dec. 4, 1904 in Emerson, the son of Charles and Elizabeth Pullman Greenwood. He married Pauline Davis on Dec. 15, 1932 in Chicago. He was a lumber yard manager in Emerson for many years and served in the Iowa legislature from 1950-1954. He retired in 1959 and the family moved to Colorado. Greenwood worked on the Boulder-Denver Turnpike for several years. He later worked at the Save-A-Mat service station in Longmont, Colo. for 10 years. He worked as a RSVP volunteer handyman, he was a 50-year member of Humanity Lodge No. 378 A.F. and A.M. in Emerson, a Son of the American Revolution and member of First Christian Church.

Survivors include his wife, Pauline of Longmont; a daughter, Jeanine Greenwood of Denver; six grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by a son, Gary, in 1964.

Services were at First Christian Church with the Rev. Dale McCann officiating. Masonic rites will be performed by St. Vrain Lodge No. 23 A.F. and A.M. A cremation will follow the service. Lewellen Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.
