Gene Hoffman

Gene L. Hoffman, 86, died Saturday, Oct. 10, 1998, at St. Anthony's Hospital in Alton.

He graduated from Iowa State University in 1938. He served in the Navy during World War II. Later he served as Iowa Director of the Farmers Home Administration and as a state senator. As a legislator, he authored the Education Reorganization Act to end one-room country schools and an act to redistrict Iowa's county voting system. In 1949, he received the Civilian Service Award for meritorious assistance to Iowa farmers. He was appointed U.S. Deputy Director of FHA in 1966 and
