Funeral services for Roy Frank were held at 11:30 a.m., Thursday, December 24, at the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Cresco. The Rev. Steven Eglund officiated. Spring burial will be in the New Oregon Cemetery. Lindstrom Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

He died at Providence Hospital in Seattle, WA, Monday, December 21, 1992, at the age of 84 years.

Roy William Frank was born January 16, 1908, in Paris Township, the son of Adam Frank, Jr. and Louise Stander. Roy attended rural schools in Howard County. He farmed with his father and two brothers in Paris Township.

On September 27, 1933, he married Adeline Niewald at St. Martin's Lutheran Church, Davis Corners. Roy and Adeline farmed in Vernon Springs Township until they moved to Cresco in 1980.

Roy was involved in many activities

over the years including the building committee and church council of Immanuel Lutheran Church where he was a member for over 50 years, the New Oregon Cemetery board, C & H Farm Service board, Election board, Howard County Experimental Farm board, ASC and Farm Bureau work and was a representative to the State Legislature. After his retirement from farming, he worked as a maintenance man at the Evans Memorial Home. His interests included the Cresco Ham Radio Club, traveling and fishing.

Surviving Roy are three children, Eugene Frank, Geraldine Bates and Dale Frank; eight grandchildren; one great granddaughter; and one sister, Elsie Sovereign.

Preceding him in death were his wife, Adeline, who died in 1991; his parents; and brothers, Edward, Howard and Lloyd as an infant.
