Dewey Summa, son of Andrew K. and Rosa Lockman Summa, was born August 4, 1898 at Vallonia, Indiana and passed away at Stewart Memorial Hospital, Lake City, Iowa on November 3, 1977 at the age of 79 years, 2 months and 29 days.

Mr. Summa moved with his parents to Mill Shoals, Illinois where he attended school. In 1917 he came to the Rockwell City area and after staying a short time moved to Anderson, Indiana. He returned to Rockwell City in 1918 and on September 20, 1922 he was united in marriage with Neva Reed at Rockwell City. Following their marriage they farmed south of Rockwell City where they have since made their home. Mr. Summa served as a Democratic State Representative from 1958 until 1961. He was a member of the United Methodist Church, IOOF Lodge, Twin Lakes Lodge #478 A.F. & A.M. and Silver Lake Chapter #312, O.E.S.

Preceding him in death were his parents; one daughter, Marian Lou in 1943; three brothers, John, Otis and Andrew and two sisters, Dora and Ethel. He is survived by his wife; three sons, Ralph of Des Moines, Iowa, Ray of Paxton, Massachusetts and Larry of Long Island, New York; four grandchildren; two great-grandsons; four brothers, Jennings of Alexandria, Indiana, Floyd of Orange, California and Guy and Ray of Anderson Indiana; two sisters, Alma (Mrs. Ivan Harpster) of Hyattsville, Maryland and Mrs. Inez Belangee of Anderson, Indiana and other relatives and friends.

REDENIUS — GARRETT

I, Josephine Irene Redenius, was born November 4, 1916 in Lake City, Iowa to Samuel and Sarah Nellie Clark Redenius.

I was the fifth member of the family; Samuel Jr. the oldest, then Lawrence E. Carl and Albert L. Carl died before I was born.

My sister, Evelyn F., was born in 1918. My earliest recollections are when I was four years old. One day dad took us kids up to Aunt Carrie Lees' and when he took us back home, there were twin brothers in a big chair in front of the kitchen range oven. Frank and Floyd they were named. They died in a few weeks, a few days apart.

At that time a bedroom was fixed for the casket and people sat all night with the body. This happened different times at our house for other relatives other than our immediate family.

I took a train ride at four years of age, too. The trains were so important. My dad hauled mail and express and freight.

I started to school at four also. The school burned when I was in first or second grade. I remember one boy who thought it was a fire drill and he stayed inside and we saw him looking out the window; he was gotten out o.k.

I went to United Brethren Church until Lincoln School was built.

Woodlawn Church burned one night and the flames were so hot we couldn't be near the living room windows. Our barn burned soon after too. It was a barn not a garage as it was used earlier for dad's mules, Jack and Jennie. I remember him telling when the fire siren blew they would run to the fire station to pull the hose cart to the fire.

My sister was run over by my dad's truck July, 1927. I will never forget that day.

My first date was when I was in 7th grade; the Methodist 8th grade boys Sunday School class had a party. It was snowy, and I didn't want to wear my overshoes and my date said, "You don't have to, I have a car." It was a model T with a door in the middle. I sat in the back seat.

In 1930 my freshman year my youngest brother, Gerald Glen Redenius, was born.

I loved school and church activities.

I was cheerleader my senior year and graduated from Lake City High in 1934.

I married H. Lyle Garrett in 1936.

Our son, Harry Samuel Garrett, was born in 1937.

Our daughter, Barbara Joan Garrett, was born in 1936; both born in Lake City, Iowa.

We moved in 1943. I did private tutoring in Council Bluffs, Iowa for 9 years and worked in the Reading program in Mesa, Arizona for 11 years. I retired in 1979.

I had joy and tears but really a good life in Lake City, Iowa. It was and is a great place to live.

My dad died in 1963. My mother died in 1973. Submitted by Josephine Irene Redenius Garrett

LAMMERT REDENIUS FAMILY

Greenfield

On August 26, 1890, Jennie Lichte was born to August and Jantja Loots Lichte, near Knierim, Greenfield Township. She was the fifth child to be born of a family of eight. Jennie attended country and parochial school at Trinity Lutheran Church one mile north of Knierim. After the eighth grade graduation and confirmation, she remained at home and helped, also worked for various families, August Hazelbrinks and Verner Davidsons and kept house for her brother George for three years. In the year 1888, on September 11, at Secor Illinois, Champaign County, a son Lammert, fourth child of John Jensen and Depka Redinus was born. He was baptized November 3, 1888 at Evangelical Lutheran Church and attended rural school and also Lutheran Parochial School and was confirmed at Evangelical Lutheran Church, Secor, Illinois in 1903.

In 1903 in company with parents and six brothers and sisters, the family moved to Sherman township, one mile east of the small town called Kissamee on the north side of Twin Lakes. also helped at home and also had a restaurant in Palmer, namely Palm Cafe. He and Jennie (above named) met by chance and decided they wanted to spend the remainder of their lives together. They were married December 27, 1916, at Trinity Lutheran Church, Knierim, by the late Rev. L.A. Mueller. They established their first home on the Runge farm, one mile south and one-half east of Pomeroy and lived there for six years. They became the parents of one daughter, Eldora (Mrs. Harold Larson), born June 2, 1921. Two years later, they moved to the Ernest Meyer farm two miles West and one-half mile south of Knoke, Butler Township. Here they lived until February 1930 when they bought the old "Gutz" farm, former home of Lammert on the north side of Twin Lakes, so it was back home for him. This farm was bought for \$300 per acre. They remained here until 1950, when they retired and bought the Tjebben house, home of John Tjebben, in Pomeroy.

In May, 1971, Lammert entered the Good Samaritan Home in Manson and remained there until August 1973 when he moved to the new Pomeroy Care Center and remained there until his death November 24, 1974. He is buried at Union Cemetery, Pomeroy. His wife Jennie, who celebrated her 90th birthday August 26, 1980 is still living in her own home and compiled the story of her family, the August Lichte Sr. and Jr. family. JOHN D.E. REED FAMILY

John D.E. Reed was born in Vigo County, Indiana on December 4, 1839. It was there he met and married Letitia Watts of Kentucky on February 24, 1859. While living in Indiana, four of their seven children were born. They were: George W., Charley, Mary Ellen and John D.E. Jr.

In 1869, John moved his family to Tama County, Iowa, where he farmed until retiring and moved to Rockwell City in 1900. While in Tama County, three children were born, all of whom died in early childhood.

It was 1883, when John, D.E. bought his first farm land in Calhoun County, located in Cedar Township. This land is still owned by his descendants, two of his great-great grandchildren.


When John and Letitia moved to Rockwell City, three of his children also moved to Calhoun County. Charley and his family moved to a farm in Lake Creek Township. Charley later bought this farm from his Dad. This is where Charley and his wife the former Catherine Logan raised their three children, Jessie, Earl and Neva. Jessie married James Martin; they were the parents of a daughter, Lois, now Mrs. Bernard Laing of Rockwell City. Jessie and Jim farmed in Calhoun County until they retired to Rockwell City and operated the Martin Motel for many years. Neva married Dewey Summa. They lived on the family farm, where they raised their family, Ralph, Ray, Marion Lou and Larry. Marion Lou died when she was a young child. Dewey served as a State Representative from Calhoun County in the late 1950's and early 60's.

Earl married Irene Rice of Lake City and they were the parents of a daughter, Theresa, now of California. Earl died during the flu epidemic of 1918 while in military service.

Mary Ellen, known as Ellie, married Charles Palmer and they made their home on Pleasant Street in Rockwell City. They had no children.

John D.E. Jr., left Rockwell City soon after moving here, going to South Dakota where he lived for the next 20 years. When he left the ranches of South Dakota he returned to Rockwell City, where he died. John Jr. never married.

In 1912, the oldest son George, retired from farming in Tama County, and moved to Rockwell City where he built a home. (This house is now occupied by the Bernard Laing's.) George was married to Mary Sawyer of New York. They were the parents of two children, Alice and Edmund. Mary was in poor health and died six years after moving to Rockwell City. Edmund died after a sudden illness without ever marrying. Alice married James Deal of Chicago, and they were the parents of one son, John Harold. Alice returned to Rockwell City when her young son was about two years old.

John spent his growing up years in Rockwell City and Farhamville. John married Catherine Frottscher of Farnhamville. They were the parents of two children, Connie and Max. John farmed the family farm in Cedar Township until his retirement in 1972, when they moved to Rockwell City.

The Reed name is no more, but there are three descendants of John D.E. Reed still living in Calhoun County, a granddaughter, Neva Reed Summa, a great granddaughter Lois Martin Laing, a great-great granddaughter, Connie Deal Blair. Submitted by Connie Deal Blair


