

GRASSLEY, Charles Ernest, a Representative and a Senator from Iowa; born in New Hartford, Butler County, Iowa, September 17, 1933; attended the public schools; graduated, University of Northern

Iowa, Cedar Fall, 1955; received a graduate degree from the same university in 1956; pursued graduate work, University of Iowa, Iowa City, 1957-1958; engaged in agriculture; part-time university instructor; member, Iowa house of representatives 1959-1974; elected in 1974 as a Republican to the Ninety-fourth Congress; reelected to the Ninety-fifth and Ninety-sixth Congresses (January 3, 1975-January 3, 1981); was not a candidate in 1980 for reelection to the House of Representatives, but was elected to the Senate for the term commencing January 3, 1981; reelected in 1986, 1992, and again in 1998 for the term ending January 3, 2005; chairman, Special Committee on Aging (1997-1999); Committee on Finance (January 20 to June 6, 2001).
