ADOLPH "ADE" WALTER ELVERS

Funeral services for Adolph Walter Elvers, 89, Elkader, were held Friday, Dec. 15, 2000, at Peace United Church of Christ, Elkader. Pastor Rusty Phillips officiated with burial at East Side Cemetery, Elkader. Music was by Jean Welsh, organist, and Harold Dohrer, soloist. Honorary pallbearers were Harold Dohrer, MaLloyd Mueller and Tom Kenney. Pallbearers were Roy Pady, Gary Helgerson, Pat Finley, Jack Dittmer, Norbert Dittmer and John Orr. He was born August 4, 1911, at Osborne, Iowa, son of Adolph W. and Mary (Dittmer) Elvers. He graduated from Elkader High School in 1924. He was united in marriage to Lola Hanson, November 26, 1934, at Peace United Church of Christ, Elkader. They made their home in Elkader where Ade operated Elvers' Insurance & Real Estate business for many years.

He was very active serving his community and state. He was on local, state and national cooperative dairy boards from 1945-1975, Elkader Co-op Board of Directors from 1948-1975 serving as president for 23 of those years, Clayton County Co-op Telephone Board from 1954-1964, Iowa State Senator from 1961-1969, Civil Defense Director for the State of Iowa from 1969-1979, Clayton County's delegate to the Older Iowans' Legislature from 1988-1994, served as president of the Iowa Law Makers in 1993, Board of Directors for Elkader Keystone Terrace, served on Central Community Hospital Board of Directors, Iowa Comprehensive Health Care Board of Directors, Upper Explorerland Low Rent

Housing committee member, long time member of the Elkader Lions Club and Elkader Masonic Lodge #72, and a life-long member of Peace United Church of Christ, serving on the church council from 1948-1951; Adolph "Ade" Walter Elvers died Tuesday, Dec. 12, 2000, at the Elkader Care Center in Elkader.

Survivors include his nine nieces and nephews, David Elvers, Mayfield, Ky.; Douglas Elvers, Durham, N.C.; Jon Elvers, Elkader; his godson, Don Elvers, Elkader; Marilyn Fay, Des Moines; Nancy Deetz, Owatonna, Minn.; Marijean Fitzgerald, Midland, Mich.; Naomi Harrelson, Shingle Springs, Calif.; and Marcia Havice, Steamboat Springs, Colo.; his sister-in-law, LaNelle Elvers, Elkader; numerous great nieces and great nephews; and a special friend, Sandra Hakert.

Arne was born January 11, 1926, in Park River, N.D., son of Rev. Selmer and Eunice (Langeland) Strandjord, the youngest of four children. He grew up in St. Olaf, Iowa. As a young boy, Arne loved accompanying his father as he traveled to conduct services throughout his parish.

Arne served in the U.S. Navy on a submarine tender in the Pacific during World War II. He graduated from Luther College in Decorah in 1950 and from Luther Theological Seminary in 1953. Arne was ordained as a minister in the Evangelical Lutheran Church June 7, 1953. He served as minister to: First Lutheran Church in Mt. Vernon, Wash., from 1953 to 1959; Immanuel Lutheran Church in Seattle, Wash. from 1959 to 1971; First Lutheran Church in Astoria, Ore., from 1971 to 1979; and Mes-
