## Former senator interred Monday

Funeral services for George Lindsay Scott, 87, who died Saturday, April 19, at the Good Samaritan Home, West Union, were held Monday, April 21, at 2 p.m. at Bethel United Presbyterian church, West Union, with Rev. William R. Jones officiating. Burial was in West Union cemetery. Arrangements were made by Burnham-Wood Funeral Home.

Pallbearers were Axel Dahl, Elver Anderson, Hugo Hackman, Earl Wilbur, Thomas Wetherbee and Senator H. L. Heying.

Mr. Scott was born July 21, 1887, on a farm near Waucoma, one of four sons of Alexander

and Margaret Scott. He attended school in the public schools of the area and was largely self-educated.



On Nov. 26, 1910, he married Merle Saltgiver at West Union, and two sons were born, J. Donald and Robert.

He farmed near West Union until his retirement in 1945. He became a member of Bethel United Presbyterian church July 12, 1914, and was elected an elder May 15, 1932. He was a charter member of the Fayette County Farm Bureau, a member of Masonic Lodge No. 69 A. F. and A.M., West Union, Za-Ga-Zig Shrine and Rotary.

He served the people of Fayette county and northeast Iowa an an elected representative for 22 years, ten as a state representative and 12 as a senator. He also served for six years on the Iowa Liquor Control Commission.

Survivors include his sons, J. Donald, West Union, and Robert, Dubuque; six grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his wife, his parents and three brothers.

Senator Scott will be honored at the biennial memorial service of the Iowa legislature at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, April 24. The service, held in the General Assembly room of the State Capitol, honors members and previous members who have died during the past two years. The event is arranged by Senator Larry Heying, West Union, who is chairman for ministers of the Senate. The family of Senator Scott has been invited to attend.

The Schwamman had eight children, Henry (deceased), Elizabeth Junk (deceased), Ferdinand (deceased), Anton (deceased), Kathryn Novotny (deceased), Luke (deceased), Joseph and John. John Sr. died Feb. 18, 1955, his wife, Anna, on Dec. 2, 1955.

#### JOHN DONALD AND CLARA (ANDERSON) SCOTT

J. Donald Scott was born on the Scott farm three miles west of West Union, Iowa, on Highway 18, Windsor Township. After three years, his parents bought land one mile north and built a new home and buildings on the corner. George L. Scott was married to Merle Saltgiver. He farmed until he retired in 1945. To that union were born two sons, J. Donald and Robert. Robert and wife, Dorothy of Bella Vista, AR, still own the farm on Hwy 18. George and wife were members of Bethel Presbyterian Church and he served as elder after 1932.

George served the people of Fayette County and northeast Iowa as an elected representative for 22 years, 10 years as a state representative and 12 years as senator. He also served for six years as a commissioner on the Liquor Control Commission. He was a charter member of the Fayette County Farm Bureau, member of Mason Lodge and a Rotary member.

They retired in West Union and she died in July 1966 and he in April 1975.

John Donald and wife, Clara Anderson, bought a farm just across the road. They had three children: James of Cedar Rapids, Larry of Glendale, AZ and Barbara who resides in Cedar Rapids with her husband, Donald Oldenburg. They have three children: Marcia who is married to Dan Hart and lives in Topeka, Kansas, Brian Oldenburg living in Cedar Rapids and Cheryl still at home.

J. Donald continued to farm until 1969 when a heart condition forced him to retire in West Union where he lived until 1992 when they moved to Meth-Wick retirement home in Cedar Rapids.

They and the family were always faithful members of Bethel Presbyterian Church while living in West Union and he and his wife still retain that membership.

They were long time members of Fayette County Farm Bureau, NFO and he served on Creamery Board and West Union Co-op. He was also a long time Rotary member.

#### SEEDORFF AND GUNLACK

Around 1870, Johann and Friederick Seedorff came from Mecklenburg, Germany to Iowa. Johann Heinrich Theodor served the required length of service in the German army. He married Maria Dortha Kiel, daughter of Joachim Frederick Kiel and Elizabeth Sophia Kanneberg. Johann with wife and daughter, Maria, came to America and settled on a farm near Aurora where they remained. Here five more children joined the family: John, William, Anna, Louise and Noble.

Friederick Joachim Seedorff came shortly after Johann arrived. He married Anna Kohler from Switzerland. This marriage took place in Fayette County, Iowa. They were the parents of six children: Frederick Karl, Lewis Ludwig, Ernest August, August Albert, Harmon and Anna Marie.

There were three Gunlack brothers who came from Germany about the same time that the Seedorffs arrived. John Gunlack married Mary Seedorff, daughter of Johann Seedorff and Elizabeth Mense. Martin Gunlack married Sophia Maria Seedorff. The third brother was Christian who married Mary Katelhoen.

Birth certificates and baptismal records from Lutheran Kirchengemeinde Domarchin Ratzeburg, West Germany, as well as family records, gravestone inscriptions in Madison Cemetery

near Aurora were used to verify dates and names.

#### ALBERT AUGUST AND MARY S. (ANDERMANN) SEEDORFF

Albert (9/16/1889 - 12/31/1955) was the youngest son of Frederick and Anna (Kohler) Seedorff. He was born in a log cabin about five miles northeast of Aurora in section 20, Putnam Township, Fayette County, Iowa. He was baptized July 6, 1890, by Rev. Graf of the Lutheran Church in Strawberry Point, Iowa. He was educated in the local Schwartz School in Section 20, Putnam #11.

Albert married Mary S. Andermann June 21, 1911, at Oelwein, Iowa. To this union were born five sons and three daughters: Darrel E., Harlan H., Donald L., Darwin H., Vernon L., Evelyn E., Arlene E., and Mildred L. Albert and his wife bought the farm and lived the rest of their lives there.

Aside from his farming he hauled milk to the Aurora Creamery for 25 years and was president of the creamery board for many years. He hauled livestock and sold feed and fertilizer for the Rath Packing Company for 20 years. He served as secretary-treasurer of the local Schwartz School for many years.

Albert and his wife, Mary, are buried in the Union Cemetery in Putnam Township.
