E. Wayne Shaw

Services were held in McAllen, Texas Monday (June 11) for E. Wayne Shaw, 85, a former Charles City resident who died Friday in Audie Murphy Veterans Hospital, San Antonio, Tx.

He is survived by his wife, Louise (409 N. 38½ St., McAllen), a daughter, Beverly Murray, Springfield, Ill., and three grandchildren.

Mr. Shaw served two terms (1954-1958) on the Charles City Council and then two terms (1958-1962) in the Iowa House.

The access road to the city land fill was named Shaw Avenue in recognition of his work on the project.

He was employed as an insurance claims adjuster and field claims supervisor by the Farm Bureau Insurance Company from 1941 until 1958.

Before coming to Charles City, Mr. Shaw was superintendent of the Hansel (Iowa) Schools. He also coached girls basketball and, during the years 1935-1941, his teams compiled a record of 125-12. His 1940 Hansel team won the state championship. During the state tournament in March 1960, he was inducted into the Iowa Girls Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame.
