Funeral services for Percie E. Van Alstine, 88, Fort Dodge, former longtime resident of Gilmore City, will be held at 10:30 a.m. today (Thursday, Feb. 10) at the Faith United Methodist Church in Gilmore City, with burial in the Marble Valley Cemetery there. She died Saturday, Feb. 5, at Friendship Haven in Fort Dodge, where she had resided since 1992.

The Schellhammer-Harris Funeral Home of Gilmore City is in charge of the arrangements, with the Rev. Russell Dilley officiating.

Survivors include a sister, Lois (Van Alstine) Holler of Sun City, AZ; two nieces; and three nephews. She was preceded in death by her parents and two brothers.

Percie Ellen Van Alstine, daughter of Howard Spicer and Mary Bertha (Beers) Van Alstine, was born Oct. 9, 1905, at Gilmore City, where she was reared and educated. She attended college at Rockford College in Illinois and the University of Iowa, where she graduated with honors in 1928.

Following graduation from college, she traveled to Europe, after which she settled in Minneapolis, MN, where she managed the Dayton Department Store Tea Room. In 1933, she again spent some time in Europe, and was then hired by the Norge Company of New York City as a kitchen equipment demonstrator.

In 1938, she was employed as a social secretary to a friend, Garnet McKee, a position she held for 10 years. Following McKee's death, she returned to Gilmore City. In 1952 she entered politics, serving two terms as mayor of Gilmore City and one term as a state representative in Des Moines.

She cared for her mother until her death in 1971, at which time she began spending the winters in Sun City, AZ, and her summers in Gilmore City. She entered the Friendship Haven Retirement Home in 1992.

In 1936, he was married to Sylvia Larson at Pomeroy and the couple made their home on a farm in the Pomeroy area. They later lived in various Iowa communities, and for eight years in Minnesota.

In 1954, they moved to a farm near Rockwell City, where they continued to live until 1967, when they moved to Humboldt. His wife died in 1989.

IT CONTAINS FOUR AND ONE HALF ACRES COUNTING THE ROAD: THE LOTS ARE 18 FEET BY 18 FT. AND THE ALLEYS AROUND THE BLOCKS ARE 8 FT. WIDE: THE ALLEYS RUNNING THROUGH THE BLOCKS ARE 6 FEET WIDE: THE DRIVE IS 20 FEET WIDE: THE CORNERS OF THE BLOCKS ARE COMMEMORATED BY BURR OAK STAKES, THE CORNERS OF THE LOTS BY PIN STAKES. THE LARGE MAPLE TREES ARE ON THE EAST SIDE OF THE CEMETERY.
