Van Langen of Kamrar, Iowa. The couple resided in Stanhope, where he was employed at the Satre Hardware Store. In 1950 to 1951, he served with the U.S. Army Infantry during the Korean War. After his discharge, he returned to Stanhope. For several years he was a Carnation milk distributor. In 1960 he was elected to the Hamilton County Board of Supervisors, serving for two terms. He served in the House of Representatives for one term. In 1964 he started Traffic Marking Services, which he operated until the time of death.

He is survived by his wife, Rachel, of Stanhope; daughters, Delayne M. Johnson of West Des Moines; Jody Busing of Des Moines; Janis Green of Urbandale; a son and daughter-in-law, Edward E. Jr. and Jill M. Busing of Stanhope; grandchildren, Matt and Jacob Johnson, Jenna Green, Johnathan and Blaise Busing; sisters, Leola McClure and Dorothy Drake, both of LaFeria, Texas; step-father, Herman T.
