Elroy Maule, Onawa, Iowa, died on April 15, 1984, at Burgess Memorial Hospital in Onawa following a lengthy illness. Death came at the age of 70 years, 11 months, and 3 days.

He was born May 10, 1913, to Charles and Jennie McElroy Maule in Kaglan Township, Harrison County, Iowa. He moved to Onawa with his parents in 1915 when he was six months old. He was a 1931 graduate of Onawa High School. After graduation from the University of Iowa, Iowa City, in 1936, he taught science and was Principal and coach at Shueyville High School in Johnson County, Iowa. He received his Secondary Principal's Certificate from the Iowa State Board of Education in 1938 after graduate work at both the University of Iowa and the University of Colorado.

On January 1, 1935, he was married to Evangeline Wickersham at Elk Point, S.D. In the spring of 1941 the couple moved to a farm west of Onawa in Lincoln Township in Monona County where they have continued to make their home. He was active in the Onawa Boy Scout Troop, former President of the Monona County Farm Bureau, has served on the Methodist Church Board and was a choir member for several years.
