

# Iowa officials say health

DES MOINES — It could take up to four years to extend health care coverage to all of Iowa's children despite a \$25 million state effort approved by lawmakers last spring.

Although it will take some time to cover all of the state's children, a special commission approved by the Legislature has already turned its attention toward covering more adults.

The commission, headed by former Govs. Terry Branstad and Tom Vilsack, is likely to spend months planning how to expand coverage. Leaders of the panel vowed to put partisanship aside.

"We know that this is just the beginning. This is an incremental process," said Branstad, a

Republican.

Vilsack, a Democrat, succeeded Branstad. The group was the most serious problem, the state doesn't have

"Ultimately, we have to confront the issue of health care."

The Legislature approved a plan in place a two-year expanded health care for the 53,000 uninsured in Iowa.

The first step was taken in July when the Legislature passed programs that cover low-income families. It is expected to reach a deal on the issue of uninsured children.

The special commission is charged with the task of covering the rest of the state and to open
