Max E. Reno dies after lengthy illness

Former Iowa State Senator and Van Buren County businessman Max E. Reno, died Sunday, July 25, at the Van Buren County Hospital after a lengthy illness.

Reno was a fixture in the county and a generous community booster. He was elected in 1964 to the Iowa State Senate and served one term. He also owned and operated a livestock sale barn and feed service in Bonaparte and a real estate and auction company. His obituary can be found inside.

Max E. Reno, 78, Keosauqua, died at 8:47 P.M. Sunday July 25, 2004 at Van Buren County Hospital in Keosauqua. He was born near Bladensburg, IA on April 22, 1926 to Sherman E. and Marjorie E. (Heady) Reno. He grew up in Bloomfield, graduated from Bloomfield High School in 1944 and attended Bloomfield Junior College. He was a U.S. Navy Veteran of World War II and served in the South Pacific Theater. He married Frances M. Hartzler in Pulaski, IA on September 26, 1948. She died June 16, 2003.

He was an Iowa State Senator from 1964-1968, an auctioneer, sold Farm Bureau Insurance, owned and operated a livestock sale barn and a feed service in Bonaparte, was a real estate broker, member of the Bonaparte Baptist Church, the Bonaparte Lions Club, the Farmington Rod and Gun Club, VFW in Keosauqua, American Legion Post 563 in Bonaparte, Iowa Auctioneer Association and the National Auctioneer Association, member of the Board of Directors for Indian Hills Community College

Foundation, KAABA Shrine and Bonaparte Lodge No. 73, AF & AM.

Three sons survive him: Stephen Reno and his wife Joanna of Ankeny; Marcus Reno of St. Petersburg, FL and Ronald "Bill" Reno of Phoenix, AR, son-in-law Stephen B. Shriver of Bonaparte and seven grandchildren. His parents, wife, daughter Heidi Hartzler Shriver and two brothers: Charles and George Reno preceded him in death.




