At the end of the workshop,

legislator charged Sunday night,  
Rep. William Gannon, D—  
Mingo, speaking at a meeting  
of the Jasper County Democrat-  
ic Women's Club; said the Re-  
publican majority in the legis-  
lature had chosen to "slash the  
Regents' request for capital im-  
provement funds, drastically  
reduce the funds to be made  
available through the new bond-  
ing law, and to vote what it  
claimed was a 12 per cent in-  
crease in operating funds" for  
the universities.

The so-called 12 per cent in-  
crease is really a decrease in  
funds, Gannon contended, be-  
cause "enrollment increases  
alone will exceed that figure  
between the beginning of the  
last biennium to the end of the  
next."

### Commended Regents

Gannon commended the  
Board of Regents for raising  
tuition.

"The State Board of Regents  
wisely chose to maintain the  
quality of the state universities  
rather than adopt the uneco-  
nomical and demoralizing pro-  
cess of backsliding dictated by  
the legislature's appropri-  
ations," he said.

The only alternative to a  
tuition increase of a magnitude  
"which had never before been  
necessary in Iowa" Gannon  
said, would have been to "close  
the universities' doors to thou-  
sands of students whose parents  
have for years supported the  
regents institutions with their  
tax dollars."

### They Were Alerted

Gannon also took Republicans  
to task for what he called the  
"hue and cry" they have raised  
because the regents raised tui-  
tions by \$200 to \$300 a year.
