nal Co., the Army Corps of Engineers and the AEC have narrowed the choice of routes for nuclear excavation to two running through unpopulated jungles.

One is a 44 -mile stretch in Panama from San Miguel Bay on the Pacific to Caladonia Bay in the Caribbean. The other is a 100 -mile route in Colombia from Humbolt Bay to the Gulf of Darien.

Another potential nuclear route, that appears to be lagging in consideration, is a 138 -mile stretch along the Costa Rica - Nicaragua border.

An AEC expert sald in an interview that most radioactive debris would be expected to fall back into the crater caused by nuclear explosion, or to land around the edges.

But he conceded some small part of the debris would likely escape.

Latest cost studies comparing conventional and nuclear excavation methods for a new canal show prices ranging from 5747 million for the 44 -mile eastern Panama route dug by atomic means to $\$ 1.8$ billion for conversion of the present Panama Canal by conventional means.
