Harry R. Gittins, 75, of 2825 Avenue L, died Saturday at Clarkson Hospital in Omaha.

Mr. Gittins was a member of the Pottawattamie County Board of Supervisors and served four terms as a state representative for this area.

He was chosen by Gov. Robert Ray to head up the state advisory board for planning and programming.

Mr. Gittins was born on the family farm in Underwood, which he still owned and lived a good share of his lifetime in the Underwood and Council Bluffs area.

He graduated from Underwood High School and played on the state champion basketball team there in 1927.

He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Mathematics from the University of Nebraska and his masters in Mathematics from UCLA.

He was a teacher, coach principal and school superintendent and a member of the Lions Club.

He and his wife, Ramona, a long-time registered nurse at Jennie Edmundson Hospital, celebrated their 45 wedding anniversary on Oct. 1.

Besides his wife, he is survived by three sons, Robert M. of Council Bluffs, Rodney P. of Underwood and Roger D. of Phoenix, Ariz.; two daughters, Mrs. Dr. Garth (Harriet) Warner and Mrs. Dennis (Patricia) Conlon, both of Seattle, Wash.; two sisters, Loretta Tey of Omaha and Lucille Driver of Council Bluffs; and seven grandchildren.

Services will be held at 1 p.m. Tuesday at the Meyer Funeral Home. The Rev. Gerald E. Leseberg, pastor of Wesleyan Bible Church, will officiate. Burial will be in Cedar Lawn Cemetery.
