### OBITUARY STANLEY M. HEABERLIN

Services were held Thursday, October 5, 1989 for Stanley M. Heaberlin at St. Paul's United Methodist Church with Rev. Michael Bahde officiating.

Music was provided by organist Martha Prichard and burial was in the Pleasantville Cemetery.

Pallbearers included John Franey, Eldon Thornburgh, Claire Prange, Rex Shoop, Arthur Anthony and Duane Prill.

Stanley M. Heaberlin was born September 4, 1908 in Harr, Tennessee and passed away at Iowa Lutheran Medical Center in Des Moines on October 2, 1989.

He was 11 years old when his parents left eastern Tennessee and moved to the Pleasantville Community. James Winton Heaberlin and Eliza Phillips Heaberlin had two

other sons and three daughters, in addition to two children who died in their childhood. Preceding Stanley in death were his brothers, Clifton and Ira; also his sisters, Dorothy and Pauline. A sister, Betty Roat, still lives in Potomic, Maryland.

Stanley graduated from Pleasantville High School in 1928. Five years later Jessie Core became his wife. For several years they lived in Pleasantville where Stanley operated his truck line. In 1947 they moved to their home farm north of Pleasantville where he started his grain farming and began to establish the seedstock herd of Hereford cattle - an endeavor of interest and pride to him until his death.

Like many people growing up in the 1930s, Stanley never found the opportunity to develop hobbies. He did give time to various boards and committees, working for better schools in his community, and promoting the dairy industry and other agriculture interests. In the '60s he served a term in the Iowa State Senate.

Stanley and Jessie raised three sons on the farm. Preceding him in death was his son Lt. Carl Heaberlin. Surviving are his wife, Jessie, and sons, Gene of Pleasantville, and Bruce of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. Included also are six grandchildren, four great-grandchildren, and several step

grandchildren welcomed into his family.
