Roy Miller of Monticello died Sunday, Oct. 26, 1997 at the Meth-Wick Retirement Community, Cedar Rapids, following a brief illness.

Roy Albert Miller was born Aug. 26, 1903, the son of Harlan and Dora Coppess Miller. He graduated from the Stanwood High School and the Cedar Rapids Business College. He then started farming in the Onslow area.

Roy Albert Miller and Ruth Aubrey Peck were married June 23, 1927 at Olin. The couple farmed near Onslow from 1927 until 1931. They later moved to Earlville where they operated the International Harvester dealerships in Earlville, Manchester, Ryan and Independence. They purchased the Schaffer International Harvester dealership at Monticello in 1947, and they moved to Monticello in 1949. The couple retired from the implement business in 1962. He then served three terms in the Iowa House of Representatives representing Jones County. The couple resided in Monticello until 1986 when they moved to the Meth-Wick Community. His wife preceded him in death on Feb. 3, 1995.

Mr. Miller was a member of the St. Luke's United Methodist Church of Monticello, the Burns Masonic Lodge, the El Kahir Shrine, the Acacia Chapter and Schreiner Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star. He also served nine years on the Monticello City Council, the Senior Housing Board, the Republican Central Committee, the Iowa Implement Dealers Association, and as President of the Residents Council at Meth-Wick.

Survivors include three daughters, Marilyn (James) Robinson of Monticello, Linda (Bill) Ballou of Manchester and Carol Miller, Fort Worth, Texas; four grandchildren, Kathryn Benson, Lorilee Andreini, Margo Ballou, Mark Ballou, four great-grandchildren, Anthony and Jordan Andreini, Taylor Andreini, Haley Ballou. Qualifying for the state meet, at the Muscatine district, besides the Panthers boys' team were Des Moines Central (61) and Davison (101).


Nikki Billmeyer led the girls team by placing second, earning district championship honors.


Kirkwood College Board. C. J. Matthiessen is serving his sixth term as Magistrate for Jones County.

Two Monticello women have served as members of the Republican State Central Committee of Iowa. Char Helgens served as a member and as Co-Chair of the Second Congressional District from 1972-1976. Diana Stadtmueller served as a member and as Chair of the Second District from 1976-1980 when she was elevated to Co-Chair of the State Committee and served through 1984.

Over the past 20 years, five Monticello residents have served as chairpersons of the Jones County Republican Central Committee, they are Jerry Bronneman, Robert Shimanek, Diana Stadtmueller, Elaine Smith, and Judy Tuetken.

Monticello Republicans have also been well represented at National Presidential Conventions with Bert Ballou serving as an alternate in San Francisco in 1964, Elaine Smith a delegate in Kansas City in 1976, and Diana Stadtmueller a delegate and Judy Tuetken an alternate in Dallas in 1984. Elaine Smith also served as the Iowa Chairperson in 1980, for the short-lived Presidential candidacy of Congressman Phil Crane.

Many other Monticello Republicans continue to serve their city and state with their contributions and leadership.
