Howard Hamilton, Extension Director, Legislator Dies

Funeral services for Howard Hamilton, 69, for 29 years Cedar county extension director and a 2 term state legislator, were held at the First United Methodist church May 20 with Dr. Glenn Parrott officiating. Burial was in the Tipton Masonic cemetery.

Pallbearers were Don Williams, Elmer Harmel, Sherman Kepford, Harold Hass, Norman Hamiel, Merlin Hulse, Wayne Miller and Ken Muller. Mr. and Mrs. Lyle Grove, Evelyn Hamiel and Mrs. Olivett Werling were in charge of flowers. Mrs. Kenneth Gould was organist. The Dye funeral home was in charge.

Mr. Hamilton died at his home in Tipton May 17 following an extended illness.

The son of Asbury and Grace Bird Hamilton, he was born at

Hampton April 5, 1909, graduated from Hampton high school and received his BS degree from Iowa State college, Ames, in 1931. He was married to Edna Hambright at the Hambright home July 7, 1940. He was a county extension director for 34 years, 5 years at Albia in Monroe county and 29 years at Tipton.

As Cedar county extension director he helped to organize the Cedar County Beef Producers, the Cedar County Swine Improvement and Swine Testing program and the Cedar County Soil Conservation district.

He was also active in the construction of the 4-H building at the Cedar county fairgrounds in 1953, with the building constructed with only volunteer help. He was a past president of the Iowa Association of County Extension Directors.

He retired from the extension service in December, 1966. Since that time he has been an agent for the Hawkeye National Life Insurance company and was cited for outstanding sales records.

Mr. Hamilton was a member of the United Methodist church. He also served as a member of the building committee of St. Luke's hospital, Cedar Rapids for several years. He was a director of the First National bank of Tipton.

He served 2 terms in the Iowa Senate, from 1969 through 1972.

A lifelong tennis player, he helped to promote the sport in Tipton, teaching the game to his sons and to other young people.

He is survived by his wife, 3 sons, Bryce H., Minneapolis, Minn.; Dennis R., Naperville, Ill. and James A., San Diego, Calif., 4 sisters, Mrs. Louis (Helen) Rank, Spirit Lake; Mrs. Keith (Barbara) Driscoll, San Diego, Calif.; Mrs. Lillian Seidell, Iowa Falls and Mrs. Ovid (Betty) Bay, Alexandria, Va. He was preceded in death by a son, Jerry.
