

Harold C. "Mac" McCormick, of 2 Julien Dubuque Drive, a former Democratic state representative and longtime Manchester, Iowa, furniture dealer, died Thursday, Aug. 17, 2000, at Ennoble Manor Care Center.

Services will be at 11 a.m. Monday at St. Mary's Catholic Church, Manchester, with the Rev. John Walsh officiating. He donated

his remains to the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn. There will be no visitation. The Hoffmann-Schneider Funeral Home, 1640 Main St., is in charge of arrangements.

He was born on Oct. 8, 1910, in Manchester, son of Charles and Mary (Powers) McCormick.

He married Doris Marie Kehoe of rural Hopkinton, Iowa, in 1940; she died in 1964. He then married Betty (Primus) O'Brien, of Independence, Iowa, in 1967. They moved from Manchester to Dubuque in 1988.

He attended St. Xavier grade and high school in Manchester and the former Columbia College, Dubuque, now known as Loras College. After service in the Army during World War II, he served as director of USO clubs in Alabama, Florida, Mississippi and Texas.

He returned to the family furniture business in Manchester that his father and a partner had established around 1900. While in Manchester he served two terms on the city council, five years on the planning and zoning commission and was a director of the Chamber of Commerce as well as president of the Manchester Lions Club. He also belonged to the Knights of Columbus, Delaware County Historical Society and Delaware County Fish and Game Society.

lished around 1900. While in Manchester he served two terms on the city council, five years on the planning and zoning commission and was a director of the Chamber of Commerce as well as president of the Manchester Lions' Club. He also belonged to the Knights of Columbus, Delaware County Historical Society and Delaware County Fish and Game Society.

He became the second Democrat ever elected from Delaware County to serve in the Iowa House in 1968. His district included parts of Dubuque, Clayton, Jones, Fayette and Buchanan counties. After serving six years in the legislature, he was appointed by Gov. Robert Ray to two terms on the Iowa Capitol Planning Commission. He also was appointed by the Iowa Legislative Council to serve on the Advisory Commission on Corrections Relief. In 1983, Gov. Terry Branstad appointed him to a Governor's Task Force on Drunk Driving. Branstad also appointed him to three four-year terms on the Iowa Board of Corrections.

After moving to Dubuque, he served two years on a city long-range planning commission and was a member of the Morning Optimists. He was also a parishioner at St. Joseph the Worker Catholic Church and later at St. Raphael's Cathedral.

Surviving are his wife Betty; a daughter, Julie (Rick) Salvesen, of Hampton, Iowa; a son, John (Dawn) McCormick, of La Grange Park, Ill.; and three grandchildren, Kari Salvesen and Michael and Conor McCormick.

He was also preceded in death by two sisters, Alice (McCormick) Bulkley and Mary J. McCormick; and a brother, Joseph, who died in infancy.
